WORK ON THE OREGON PACIFIC.

The Road to Be Completed to Mehamah Within Ten Days.

About 160 white and Chinese laborers were taken to the front to work on the Oregon Pacific railroad yesterday. There were 700 white laborers to work for Myers & Co. and sixty Chinese to work on the contract of Searle & Deane.

This is only a sample of the many laborers who are daily going to the front to work on the eastward extension of the road. The track is now finished to within five miles east of Mehamah, and within ten days it is expected it will be completed to that place.

Work is being pushed vigorously on all parts of the road, and the close of this season's work will probably witness the completion of the road as far as Brighten-bush, sixty miles east of this city.

The bridge across the Santiam at Mills City is progressing finely. The two west piers are in and the stay cords and temporary work is all in place, while a good working crew are rapidly pushing the work along.

Several new saw mills will be erected in various places along the line to furnish the necessary timber for construction. The mill of Simms & Co. at Mills City is expected to start up Monday.

The machinery is nearly all in place and the force at work on the race expect to have it finished by Saturday night. Early in the spring it is proposed to push the work of construction forward and tap the great wool growing district of Crook county, which promises to add materially to the trade of this city next season.

The road will then be pushed through the rich Malheur country and to connect with the Chicago & Northwestern at Boise City without any further delay.

Oregon Loses the Suit.

The secretary of the interior has confirmed the decision of the general land commissioner in the case of D. S. Richards vs. the state of Oregon as presented by the appeal of the state from the decision of the commissioner rejecting the claim of the state to the land in section thirty, township twenty-three south, range thirty-one east Willamette meridian, Lakeview Oregon.

The state claimed the land on the ground that it was swamped and overflowed by reason of its being located on the mountain, and snow melted in summer, said overflow from the melting snow so irrigated the land that it was regarded as valuable; otherwise it would be valueless.
