CRIMINAL CASES.

Indictments Returned by the Grand Jury - The Siftings Case. In the circuit court yesterday the following indictments were found by the grand jury: Against James Pittsford and Geo. Mealy for selling liquor in quantities less than one quart without license therefor in the saloon of Ad. Harmon on Rock Creek. Against James W. Cross for larceny of articles of the value of \$23.50 in the residence of James Mooney. The Siftings libel case was examined by the grand jury yesterday, but up to the hour of adjournment of court at 9:30 last night no further indictments were returned.

A STATEMENT.

The Spokane Jail Break.

Miller the murderer of Cole, who broke jail at Spokane a few days ago as related in the HERALD's dispatches, has been recaptured. The sheriff offers a reward of \$250 for the capture of the other escaped prisoners. Advices from Cheney are to the effect that the town is much excited over the behavior of two men, Bennett and Courtney, who went there to hunt escaped prisoners. It is alleged they held up a number of prominent citizens under pretence that they were the men they were looking for. Edward Connolly, who had been in town at a republican rally, was returning home, when he was shot at several times by these men. They were arrested and held to appear before the grand jury in the tune of \$1000 bail, which is not yet furnished. The sheriff denies that they were deputies.

Attempt to Find Natural Gas.

The News says: An attempt to obtain natural gas at Cle-elum, in Washington Territory, is being vigorously prosecuted. The boring has now reached a depth of a little over 600 feet. Even if gas is not obtained, the result of the boring will have proven that vast wealth in the shape of coal, which can be easily mined, lies beneath that town. When down a little over 400 feet a stratum of coal seven feet thick was struck. It is intended to keep on boring the gas well until a depth of 1000 feet is reached, if a good flow of gas is not had before that. The company engaged in this enterprise is wealthy and has spent upwards of \$10,000 already, including the work and cost of machinery.

Unique Affair.

Monday evening, being the tenth anniversary of the marriage of Rev. and Mrs. A. M. Acheson, of Oakville, their many friends and parishioners took occasion to call upon them en masse and unexpectedly, and spent a very sociable and pleasant evening. They brought with them many substantial remembrances with which they made Mr. and Mrs. Acheson richer and happier than before. Rev. S. G. Irvine, who united the happy couple ten years ago was present and enlivened the time with happy speeches, and was assisted in the same by Rev. Gould of Shedd. The occasion was one long to be remembered.

A Prisoner From Lakeview.

The Salem Journal says: Sheriff Wm. Carl, of Lake county, arrived in this city Sunday with Charles L. Wyman, who was sentenced to a term of three years in the penitentiary, convicted of horse stealing. Wyman is a big, burly fellow of about thirty-three years. The sheriff was assisted on the journey by deputy prosecuting Attorney Charles Moores, as the trip was of such length. To reach here from Lakeview it is necessary to stage it for one hundred and sixty miles, and consequently is a most tedious journey, when to it is added the labor of guarding a prisoner.
