E. W. Langdon Purchases an Interest in the First National Bank; Mr. E. W. Langdon, well and favorably known in business circles in this city, who has recently returned from California, has purchased of Geo. E. Chamberlain, cashier of the First National Bank, a portion of his interest in the bank; Mr. Chamberlain has resigned his position as cashier, to take effect on January 1st, and Mr. Langdon will probably be his successor; Mr. Langdon was in business in Albany for many years, and is an energetic business man; He is pleased to see him relocate here permanently; He has purchased the residence of Mr. Chamberlain, paying for the same \$4000; Mr. Chamberlain retains an interest in the bank, but will resume the practice of law.

LEBANON NEWS.

A Case of Small Pox in the County South of Seaside - Other Notes.

Special to the Herald. LEBANON, Nov. 16.—There is a case of small-pox three miles south of Seaside. Mr. Gas. Thompson last week went to Portland to attend his son Clyde, who died of small-pox on the 8th of this month; Mr. Thompson came home and yesterday broke out with the dreadful disease; A car load of Lebanon citizens came home last night, all afflicted over Albany's notification.

Oregon Swamp Lands.

Lengthy petitions have been presented by Congressman Hermann to Secretary Vilas, signed by settlers in Klamath county, Oregon, who represent that they reside on lands in township 39 south, ranges 8 and 9 east; township 38 south, ranges 8 and 9 east; township 37 south, range 9 east, and are bona fide settlers thereon, under the homestead and pre-emption laws, and that large portions of said lands have been located and selected as swamp lands by the state, through false representations as to their true character; that unscrupulous land monopolies have antagonized the rightful claims of the settlers and homesteaders, and they ask the interior department to institute a full and searching investigation to the end that their rights, as well as the rights of the state and general government, may be finally and equitably adjusted; On one of the petitions there are 120 names of settlers, many of them leading citizens of Klamath county.

The Electors Will Meet.

C. W. Fulton, William Kapus and Robert McLean, the electors chosen at the recent election, will meet in Salem, on Wednesday, December 5th, and vote by ballot for president and vice-president of the United States; According to article XII. of the constitution, they shall name in their ballots the persons voted for as president and the person voted for as vice-president; They must also make full and complete lists of all the persons voted for as president and vice-president, with the number of ballots cast for each; These lists the electors must sign and swear to, making three distinct copies; One for the president of the senate, another for the judge of the District court, and a third for the Secretary of State; One of the electors is then delegated to convey the lists to Washington; Orestes Benjamin and Levi will be elected, but it has not yet been decided which one of the three electors would be selected to act as messenger to Washington.

Very Contemptible.

The Democrat with its accustomed want of decency and respect for truth, says concerning Thursday night's parade: "Many phases of business were nicely illuminated, the French and Merrill corner particularly attracting attention, as well as Dr. Ellis' office; Among the residences that of Mrs. Doll Lawrence attracted the most attention, being artistically illuminated; Previous to the beginning of active proceedings the several Chinese houses showed their unbounded joy by the firing of fire crackers; This intentional commingling of the names of well known citizens and houses of ill fame is quite in keeping with the small-soiled scribble of the above paragraph; Perhaps his attention was more closely given to the quarters he mentions than elsewhere, for no one else seems to have seen any Chinese participate in the demonstration or fire any bombs; It is all in the very small mind of the writer who furnishes such nice, clean little paragraphs for family reading.

Demonstration at Yaquina.

Private advices from Yaquina City bring the information that the republicans of that little burg celebrated the election of Harrison and Morton by appropriate ceremonies on Monday evening last, which included an immense bonfire on the beach, a procession of enthusiastic republicans, firing of salute and other evidences of exuberance in the part of the victorious union; A large delegation was present from Newport, with banners, transparencies and music and assisted in painting the town a crimson hue; The boys are feeling good all along the line.

As Arrested.

A dispatch from McMinnville, Yamhill county, says that Willard McCune, of Sheridan, the young man who shot and killed James Bewley at Sheridan at the time of the small-pox scare, and who was arrested and committed to jail, has again been arrested; Bewley was placed in jail on the 14th; At the time of the killing Bewley was residing in McMinnville, and was acting as a quarantine guard.

BROWNSVILLE WOOLLEN MILLS.

They Are to be Sold to the Highest Bidder Next Month.

A gentleman from Brownsville states that the change in the management of the Brownsville Woollen Mills mentioned in the Herald some time ago will be consummated about the first of the year; A meeting of the stockholders was held recently, at which it was decided to sell the entire plant to the highest bidder in order to allow certain members to retire and others to bid in the property and assume entire control of the mills, so the mills will probably be run by some of the same managers as at present.

Mr. Thos. Kay, one of the present owners of the Brownsville mills talks of starting woollen mills in this city; He expects to sell his interest there and start a mill of his own somewhere in Oregon.

THE POTATO MARKET.

San Francisco has drawn quite heavily upon the Oregon market for potatoes; Already not less than 40,000 bushels have been sent to that city per steamship, and the prospects are that much heavier shipments will follow; The reason for the large amount of potatoes coming in at present for San Francisco is that prices in that city have advanced very markedly of late; Still, one former recently sent down 200 sacks on his own account, and after discharging them through a commission merchant found himself just \$50 in debt by the transaction.

The potatoes were gathered before the ground had been cooled by the late fall weather, and, in consequence, rotted badly; It is claimed by experienced parties that potatoes will keep just as well this year as usual, if they are not dug from the ground too early; If they stay in till the heavy frosts they will keep much better, and will bear longer shipments and rough usage.

Arrested for Kidnapping his Child.

A. J. Houston, of Seaside, who recently kidnaped his own little girl, which had been given into the legal possession of his divorced wife, was arrested last night on a warrant sworn out by the girl's mother; He will be examined before Justice Humphrey to-day; It is said he sent the little girl to relatives in California.

A County Judge Resigns.

W. W. Steiner, county judge of Gilliam county, has tendered his resignation to Governor Penney, with a request that his successor be appointed before December 1st; He assigns no reason for his resignation, which is probably made on account of the pressure of private affairs in connection with his extensive business at Fossil.

Southern Pacific Pay Car.

The Southern Pacific pay car we all over the road yesterday, paying off its employees for October; It went over to Corvallis on the Oregon Pacific, and went down the West Side road.

Steamer Arrived.

The steamer Willamette Valley arrived at Yaquina yesterday morning; A special train brought the valley bound passenger to this city last evening.

FROM THE STATE CAPITAL.

Salem's Street Railway to be Completed by February 1st.

Special to the Herald. SALEM, Nov. 16.—The board of directors of the Salem street railway company at a meeting today definitely located the proposed road to be constructed this winter and completed the specifications ready for bids; It will be built through the business part of Commercial street up State street to the railroad and thence along Twelfth street to the O. & C. depot, a distance of one and 2/3 miles; About half the distance will be planked and the remainder will be gravelled; The rolling stock will at first consist of four single horse cars; The specifications call for the completion of the track from Commercial street to depot by January 1, 1889, the whole track by January 15 and the whole contract by February 1, 1889; Bids for construction will be opened Tuesday, Nov. 29.
