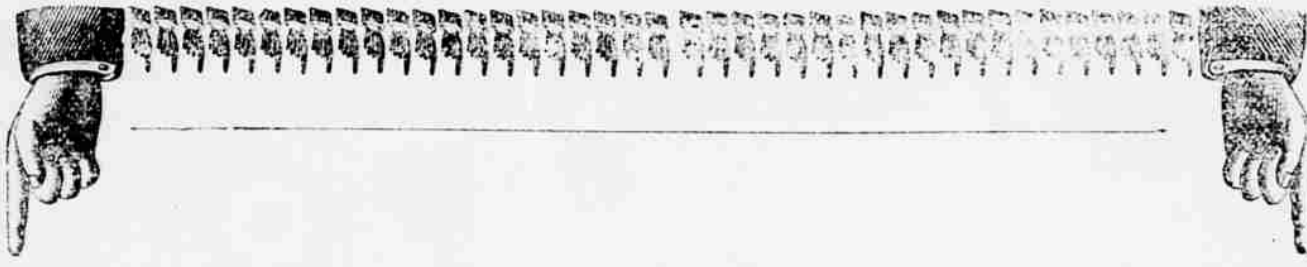

GENERAL NEWS

A Woman's Frightful Leap to Death in Ohio.

FASTEST OCEAN TRIP ON RECORD.

Across the Atlantic in Six Days and Two Hours—A Pilot and Crew of Two Men Drowned.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio, Nov. 19.—This morning Miss Goudert, a French governess, committed suicide at the residence of the well-known iron manufacturer, Henry O. Bonnell. She arrived at Youngstown ten days ago from New York and soon after showed symptoms of mental disturbance. This morning while engaged in burning some letters she jumped through a window, striking the flagstone fifty feet below. She died within an hour without regaining consciousness.

THE FASTEST TRIP.
The Quickest Trip Ever Made Across the Atlantic Ocean.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—According to a cable dispatch from Queens-town, the Umbria reached that port at 10 o'clock last night. According to this the Umbria made the fastest eastward passage across the Atlantic on record, the time being six days, two hours and twenty-two minutes. The best eastward passage heretofore was made by the Etruria in April, 1888, in six days, four hours and forty minutes. The best westward passage on record is six days, one hour and fifty minutes, made by the Etruria. According to all accounts brought in by ships from the western ocean, the Umbria had a howling northwest gale to boom her along the whole week through.

Italian Flag Raised.
ZANZIBAR, Nov. 19.—An Italian flag has again been hoisted on the Italian consulate. It was hoisted by direction of the sultan.

Lord Randolph Churchil's Views.
LONDON, Nov. 17.—Lord Randolph Churchill, in a speech at Paddington to-day, expressed a hope that post of Minister at Washington would soon be filled. There was no doubt Lord Sackville had been primarily indiscreet and made an inexcusable blunder. No fault could be found with the action of the United States toward the Minister. The American people were essentially and justly proud in their relations with other countries. He deprecated the insulting and menacing articles of press since Lord Sackville's dismissal, and if Mr. Elihu Washburne ought to be the American that they cherish no ill feeling towards them.

NASHUA, Nov. 16.—Pilot Evans and a crew of four were wrecked the bar on Nov. 12, by the capsizing of their boat during a squall.

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—The body of Henry W. King, Jr., who was killed in Omaha Saturday by Mrs. Beecher, was forwarded here this morning.

Boats Ordered Out.
BERLIN, Nov. 19.—The government has sent a torpedo boat and a dispatch boat to assist in the blockade of an Eastern African port.

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STORMY WEATHER AT SEA.

One Sailer Killed and Others Injured by a Local Wave.

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—The Commander Etruria, which arrived this afternoon, experienced one of the worst passages in her history. Tuesday last a tidal wave swept over the big steamer and one sailor was killed, five others were more or less severely shaken up.

The fatality occurred Tuesday afternoon. The injured sailors were on duty at the time the tidal wave struck the ocean racer. They saw the mountain of water, approaching and terrified they scrambled for safety. But with irresistible force the green waters curled over and fell upon the big steamer. Like logs the five sailors were jammed in a heap against the deck house and one, as stated, was killed, and the others injured. The wave washed the steamer fore and aft. The officers and crew were reticent about the accident, and the only information that could be obtained was from passengers.

SAN FRANCISCO NOTES.

Estimate of the Year's Salmon Pack General Court Martial Ordered.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 17.—Estimate of the salmon pack for 1888 are nearly complete. The pack will not exceed 900,000, as against 997,000 last year. The Columbia pack is about 350,000 cases, and the Alaska canneries have put up about the same quantity.

The tug Sea Lion, sailed for Port Townsend this evening, where she will engage in the towing business for the Ship owners and Merchants Tug Boat Company, of this port.

Colonel Norris, of the department of the Columbia, has arrived here to take the place of Colonel Bailey, medical director of the division of the Pacific, who has been retired.

A general court martial has been ordered to convene here Monday December 3rd, for the trial of Second Lieutenant Hampton M. Roach, first Infantry, U. S. Army, who is stationed at Fort Gaiton, is accused of financial irregularities.

Notes and Comments Concerning Harrison's Election.

ABOUT AN EXTRA SESSION.
The Speakership Contingency Concerning the Inauguration Ceremonies—Newsp Notes.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—The House of Representatives, all won in one day which gives Republicans the right to be proud of their party, its principles and great justice now taking place all over the country, and those who do not like it must keep themselves out of hearing for some time to come. No person who has not lived in Washington under Cleveland's administration and seen the "I've come to stay and the government belongs to us," style advocated by the average office-holder can form any idea of the great joy felt here by republicans over the republican victory of Tuesday last. Republicans meet each other on the street and with clasped hands thank God that with clasped hands thank God will soon be over.

Much amusement has been created here by the circulation of thousands of tickets, gotten up in the main body of the ticket a follows: "Grand popular excursion up Salt river on March 4th 1889, on the English built steamer 'Free Trade'."

Gov. Cleveland master Dan Lamont mate, Lord Sackville, pilot trooper steward Don't miss the popular excursion. Committee arrangements, Barnum, Gorman and Brice, Eugene Higgin, passenger agent. For state rooms apply to the civil service commission. At one end is a coupon reading, "No return checks issued." By order of the American people. N. B.—The notice of this coupon, after a lapse of one year, if you get by free franchise republicans, may be taken into the republican party and given a chance to reform. Good for one dish of crow served to order, with red bandanna napkins, and the second, "Good for thirteen democratic drinks," one pint of each of Georgia mountain dew or Kentucky Bourbon moonshine whiskey." It is doubtful if there is a single democrat office-holder in Washington who has not received one of these tickets from some republican friend. They were gotten up and printed by the Republic, a republican paper with a black border surrounding the words "In Memoriam, Free trade died November 6th 1888."

There is a report that an extra session of the forty-first Congress will be called immediately after the 4th of March. Just how much Congress there is for the rumor I cannot say—probably very little, but at any rate it has caused the organization of the next House to be talked about. The contest for the speakership will be between Root of Maine, and McKinley of Ohio, with Cannon, Burrows and several looming up as dark horses.

Most persons here seem to think at this time, that McKinley owing greatly to his actions at the Chicago convention this year, will have an easy walk over. But in taking their opinions it must be kept in mind that the people expressing them are not the ones who will nominate and elect the speaker of the forty-first Congress. Everybody argues that Hon. Edward McPherson, who is entitled to great credit for his shrewd and able management of the republican congressional committee in the campaign just past, will resume his old position as clerk of the House, under the new organization. For the other prominent positions, doo-keeper, sergeant at arms and postmaster, no particular favorites seem to have the lead so far.

Local republicans have already taken the preliminary steps towards the inauguration ceremonies. It is probable that a building will have to be erected for the Inaugural ball. For Garfield's and Cleveland inaugurations there were new Government buildings near enough completion to be utilized, the first being the National Museum and the latter the Pension office.
