THE ALBANY SAW-MILL.

Three Million Feet of Logs En Route to These Mills.

The recent heavy rains has raised the Calapooia so that the 3,000,000 feet of logs, owned by H. F. Merrill, which have been placed in the stream to be floated down to the saw-mill in this city, have been started down. About three-quarters of a million feet of the logs have been floated down as far as Crawfordville, and can be brought to Albany without trouble.
