### THE ASTORIA R. R.

An Important Railroad Line Heading Toward Albany.

TO CONNECT WITH THE O. P.

The Proposed Route—What Has Already Been Done Concerning the Project—View of Astoria.

Considerable is being said by the Salem newspapers concerning the proposed Astoria & South Coast Railway, with the hope of securing a change in the original route, which is to connect with the Oregon Pacific at Albany, making a detour to pass through the state capital. Whether or not Salem will be successful in this will probably depend upon the enterprise manifested by the citizens of Albany.

The road from Astoria to Tillamook is now assured, an incorporated company with ample capital having already begun the work. An encouraging fact for Albany in connection with this road is that last fall when action was taken upon the matter by the citizens of Tillamook they held a meeting and accepted the proposition of Mr. C. A. Cass and wealthy Chicago syndicate to build the road from Albany to connect with the Astoria coast railroad. The proposed

line of the route will be from the head of Alder creek, near Fuqua's toll gate. The line would follow the natural water courses of this country, leaving them at no place over one-half mile. The line would follow Alder Creek to its junction with Three Rivers; down Three Rivers to Big Nestucca; up the Nestucca to the mouth of Beaver Creek; up Beaver Creek to its forks; up the west fork of Cedar creek to Tillamook river. The country is almost level.

From that point it is a level or rolling country for many miles, crossing the Trask, Wilson and Kitchis rivers, thence around the most shore of Tillamook bay to the Miami river, up this river some six miles, thence across the divide of Foley creek. This divide will probably require a 1 per cent grade. The survey should continue down Foley creek to the south fork of the Nehalem river, crossing this river following down stream to the north fork, up the north fork to Buchanan's place, thence across a low divide to Lattie or Nekanikum creek, thence down the Nekanikum to the seaside, thence across the Clatsop plains to Astoria. This route has many advantages over any other leading to Astoria; first, as to distance. From Albany to Astoria by section lines, via Tillamook, it is 34 miles west and 110 miles north. From Albany to Portland it is 21 miles east and 62 north; Portland to Astoria is 48 miles north and 58 miles west, showing a balance of departure of 42 miles in favor of the Tillamook route, and the alignment would surely be better than by way of the Columbia.

The grades would be very light. Crossing the Coast range would require heavier grades for a short distance than by the way of the Columbia, yet this would be offset by the Willamette valley being much higher than the Tillamook valley, giving the heavy loads seeking deep water the benefit of the down grade. The cost of construction per mile should be 50 per cent cheaper than either the Columbia or Forest Grove, as

#### A Terrible Fight with Inmates of a Lunatic Asylum.

OFFICERS SHOOT THE MANIACS.

News from the Orient—Huntington Said to be Opposed to the Chinese Exclusion Bill.

AUBURN, (N. Y.), Jan. 4.—Tonight five inmates of the criminal insane asylum here made a desperate break for freedom. One attendant had been left in charge of the hall, in which were forty-four prisoners. At a favorable opportunity five men sprang upon him and in their eagerness to secure him nearly tore the clothing from his body. With the keys the gang opened the door leading to the yard. Here they encountered another attendant, and another battle took place. The officer broke his musket in pieces over their bodies. The insane men triumphed, but gained the open air only to be met by a third attendant, who fired into the gang, disabling one of them. This shot alarmed the other keepers, who, after a hard tussle, secured the mad men and returned them to their cells.

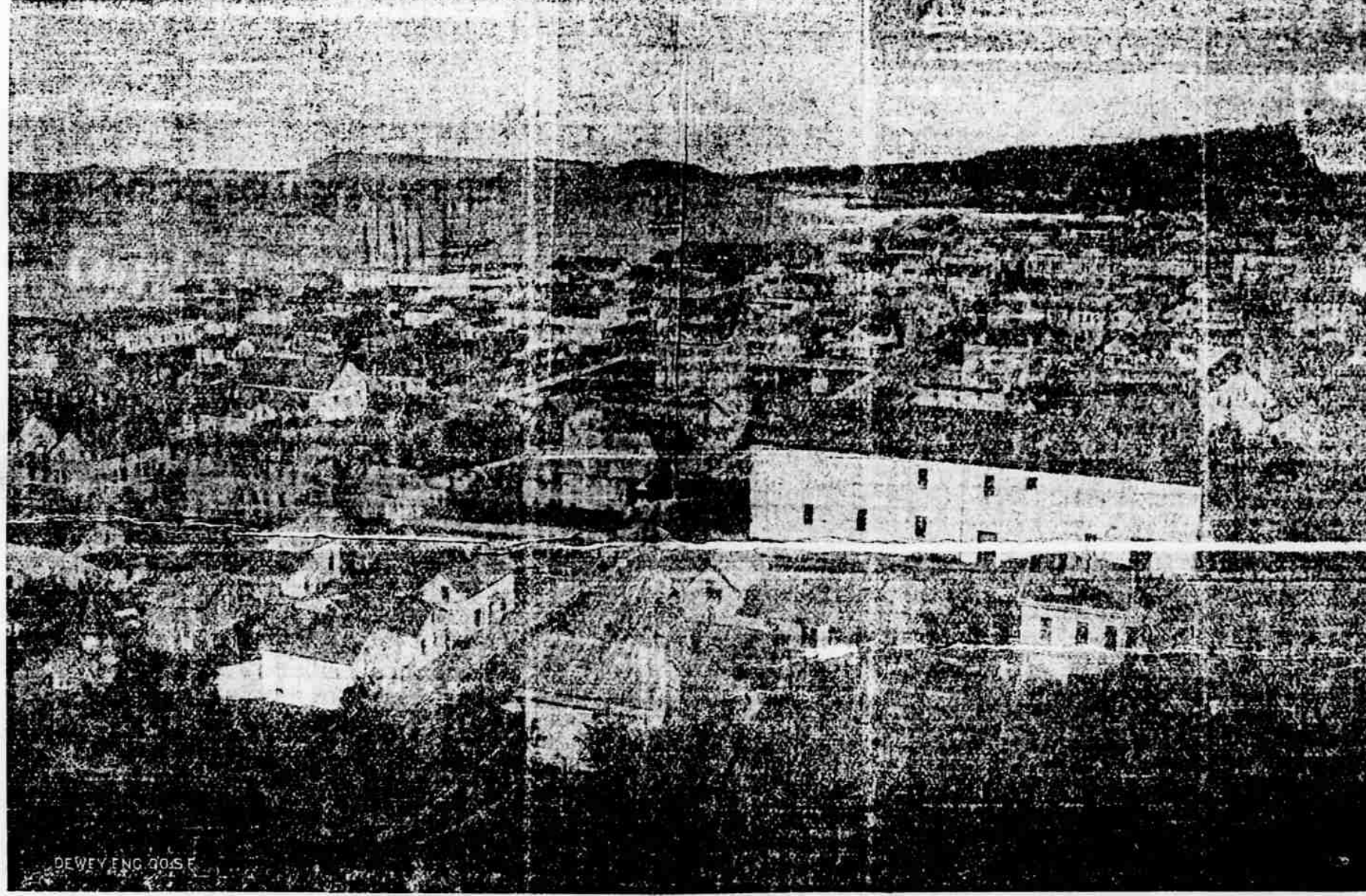

### CHINESE EXCLUSION BILL.

C. F. Huntington said to be Urging Its Abrogation.

New York, Jan. 4.—A local paper prints a statement that Collis P. Huntington, through A. A. Lov, asked the chamber of commerce yesterday to favor the amending or abrogation of the Chinese exclusion bill.

Huntington, in a long letter, protested that the bill is injurious to the commercial relations of the two countries. Huntington does not believe that honest people in America are opposed to the Chinese trade, which, he says, is falling off with China because of the bill, and besides there is no reason why the Chinese should not retaliate. In that event, he adds, the American trade now drifting to England and other powers would be altogether lost. Huntington further says the measure was the result of a partisan pressure and a political device.

"Is not this," he concludes, "a heavy price to pay for the hoodlum vote of California. For I believe the fanatical hostility to industrious Chinaman is limited to California, while the Irish Catholics swing the balance of power."
