EDITORIAL NOTES.

An American company has recently secured from the Brazilian government an immense tract of country bordering on the Amazon river in the Andes mountain regions. The object is to open up gold and diamond mining regions.

The latest phase of the elevated railroad problem in the eastern cities is that the electric motor will step in and give a perfect noiseless, smokeless and efficient power to run the train, and thus relieve the public from many of the annoyances.

ANARCHIST LUCY PARSONS has made another speech in Chicago, announcing that she is revolutionist and that revolution must come. She says "that behind the ballot must be a Winchester rifle."

Another lesson or two probably will learn her that behind the use of the Winchester rifle may linger a hangman's halter, which sometimes chokes off such disturbing talkers as herself.

NEWS comes of a pitiable state of affairs among the Norwegian farmers of Walsh county, Dakota. It is said there are about fifty families almost destitute. The only means of subsistence they have or have had for some time is cooking their green frozen wheat into a sort of porridge. They live within the belt where early frosts did the greatest damage and had relied solely on this season's crop to tide them over the winter, but this calamity left them with absolutely nothing.

ONE of the most gigantic swindles lately perpetrated, was the so called Electric Sugar Refining company, the only commercial standing of which was based upon a secret process of refining sugar by the aid of electricity. Stock of the company was sold at fabulous prices, the buyers being mostly Englishmen, but when the test was made it was found that the whole secret process was a fraud, and that the money invested was lost. People like to be humbugged.

RECENTLY a robber, in Los Angeles, who had lain under a bed until the occupant of the bed had retired and gone to sleep and then crawled out, rifled the pockets of the lodger and escaped, was captured through the aid of the image in the dust or the floor where he had lain on his back, waiting for the occupant of the bed to commence to snore. He will probably dust the floor before reclining in a similar locality again.

THE loss of a steamboat on the Mississippi river, by being snagged accompanied with the destruction of its cargo and the loss of eight lives, suggests to the thinking mind that, in these days when vessels can easily be constructed with air and watertight compartments, it is time that such distressing accidents should cease.

EVERY person who fully appreciates that most abominable of all nasty things—the cigarette—will agree with the Evening Telegram in this: "Mrs. Cleveland succeeded in performing one good act the other day for which we are tempted to pardon a dozen of her husband's grievous misdeeds. THE subject of storage reservoirs in the mountainous regions, for the purpose of retaining the excessive water supply of winter and spring for use as needed during the dry season of the year is being agitated in different parts of the country. Congress has already made some provisions looking to that end and California is now taking up the project and may make experiments that will eventually lead to a regular and extensive system of reservoirs and irrigation ditches that will embrace nearly the entire state.
