DESCRIPTION OF THE BLUEBERRY

The Blueberry is a valuable fruit and is reliable to grow in our Northern states, where the more tender varieties of fruits winter-kill. It is perfectly hardy, having stood 40 degrees below zero without showing any injury to the most tender buds. It ripens in this latitude about the 1st of July, and is borne in clusters like currants, shape, round; color, reddish purple at first, but becomes a bluish-black when fully ripened. The flavor is equal to the raspberry, a very mild, rich sub-acid, pronounced by most people delicious. It may be served with sugar and cream or cooked sauce, and is splendid for winter use. The plant seems to flourish in all soils and is a prolific bearer. It grows in rows two or three feet apart, and makes a nice hedge. The shining dark green leaves and the blue fruit making a pleasing contrast. The demand for the fruit is great, and usually brings 15 cents per quart. They commence bearing the first year after setting out, and yield a full crop the second and third year after setting out. They are propagated from suckers under root cuttings. The plants are under root cuttings, and five or six feet between the rows, making a perfect hedge, and no grass or weeds should be allowed to grow between rows.

GENERAL NEWS.

Concerning the Admission of the Territories.

IMPORTANT MEASURE IN CONGRESS

Preparations for the Inauguration of President Harrison—A Hundred Miners Entombed by an Explosion.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—Governor West, of Utah, made an argument before the committee on territories today against the admission of Utah. He declared that gentiles could not live there if admitted as a territory. Would democrats see the folly of favoring such a course? Admission would kill the party favoring it in all other territories.

CIGAR MAKERS' STRIKE.

Over a Thousand Men Are Out in New York City.

NEW YORK, Jan. 18.—All the cigar makers in forty Havana cigar manufactories in this city struck to-day against a reduction of \$2 per thousand, which the bosses made eighteen months ago. The strikers are mostly Cubans. The work is all hand made, and brings the best prices in the market. Three firms have already yielded. Over one thousand hands are out.

DISASTROUS EXPLOSION.

A Hundred Miners Entombed by a Fire Damp Explosion.

LONDON, Jan. 18.—A fire damp explosion occurred to-day in the Hyde colliery near Manchester. Seven bodies have been taken from the mine. A hundred persons are still entombed. Twenty-five persons were killed.

Preparations for the Inauguration.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—Governor Beaver, of Pennsylvania, chief marshal of the inaugural procession has issued an order calling on all organizations desiring to participate to notify him at headquarters before February 20th. A civic company of less than fifty in number will not be permitted in line, or with improper costume or equipment.

The Admission of Dakota.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—The house has agreed to Springer's omnibus bill as a substitute for the senate bill for the admission of South Dakota. Yeas, 133; nays, 121.
