It is perfectly hardy, having stood 40 de-grees below zero without thowing any injury to the most tender buds. It ripens in this latitude about the 1st of July, and is borne in clusters like cur-rants; shape, round; color, reddish purple at first, but becomes a bluish-black when fully ripened. The flavor is equal to the "aspberry," a very mi'd, rich sub-acid, pronounced by most people delicious. It may be served with sugar and crean or cooked sauce, and is splendid canned for winter use.
