EDITORIAL NOTES.

KANSAS CITY, Missouri, is inaugurating a new departure in the line of guarding against fire. It is the forbidding of the use of wooden partitions in buildings, within the fire limits. Wire lath are used instead of wood.

The remark of every individual, in Oregon, is that thus far we have had no occasion to find fault with our winter, or rather with our lack of winter, for in reality there has been no winter weather. Oregon beats the world for climate.

New improvements and inventions as well as new uses of old ones are being constantly brought into use. The latest in street pavement novelties is the use of steel bars in one case and of India rubber in another case; both being reported as desirable improvements.

ALTA says that this Samoan fess is over nine islands, called the Navigator Islands, and named Manua, Olosinga, Otu, Anun, Tutuila, Upou, Manono, Apolima and Savaii. The group was named by a French Admiral, who landed there in 1768, and had the singular felicity of having an officer and eleven men killed and eaten, when he declared in navy French that those folks were navy-gaters.

On the subject of illiteracy and crime the Chronicle thinks despite all the means of popular education, illiteracy is increasing in this country, and, what is a far worse symptom, the ratio of criminals convicted of grave crimes is growing every year. The official figures show these facts: In 1850 there were 290 prisoners in our penitentiaries to each million of population. In ten years this ratio had grown to 607, and in another decade to 853. By 1880 this ratio had been swollen to 1169, and if the same percentage is maintained the opening of the next century will see the ratio reach the enormous number of 1800. The problem of cutting down this increase of grave crime is one which is worthy the attention of phrenologists and social reformers.

The Oregonian says of Senator Dawson's bill to suppress the sale of cigars and tobacco to minors: There is one bill that should pass the legislature. Doubtless there are others, but the bill to which special reference is now made is that which prohibits the sale of cigars to minors. Of course, the matter of enforcing the law would be a serious question, but with the maternal slipper at one end of the line and the police force of the city at the other much might be done toward breaking up the insidious, all pervading and disgusting habit. There are those who believe that the timely and vigorous application of the maternal slipper would render such a law unnecessary, while others think that paternal example would be a valuable auxiliary to the slipper method. Be this as it may, the evil is serious enough to justify a combination of forces against it.

SPEAKING of the immigration bill before congress, reported by the committee on labor and immigration, and based upon the investigations made at New York, Boston, Pittsburg and other points, the Prairie Farmer says that the time has arrived when the country must, for self-protection, look to character of the strangers who flock to its shores from all parts of the earth. The possibility of making the United States a dumping ground for the paupers, lunatics and scapgraces of other nations must be removed. The European nations which have been thus imposing for years upon the hospitality of our republic must be taught that they can practice such impositions no longer. America welcomes to her shores and to a share of her vast resources the honest, peaceable, thrifty working people of all nations, but there is no room here for the thriftless and shiftless and such as cannot live in content-

ment under the freest government in the world. The present move in the direction of legislation calculated to grapple finally with the evils of unrestricted immigration is a wealthy sign of the times, out of which we may speedily hope for the enactment of a law that, while equitable towards all who seek a home within our borders, will conserve the welfare of our people and maintain the stability of our institutions.

SPEAKING of foreign trade matters the New York Tribune says that foreign trade has a better appearance, in spite of a decline in cotton exports after the exceptionally large movement of December, for in three weeks of January only 353,595 bales have gone out, against 411,062 last year, and in spite of the continued suppression of wheat exports, the value of goods exported from New York for two weeks of January is 20 per cent. larger than last year. In December the exports of cotton, breadstuffs, provisions, cattle and oil amounted to \$46,812,102, against \$54,545,195 last year, which appears to indicate that merchandise exports in December were probably more than \$85,000,000 in value, and exceeded imports by more than \$30,000,000. So heavy a movement is the more remarkable because in wheat, cattle and oil there was a decline in value exported.
