INCREASE OF POPULATION.

The Evening Telegram says that the irrepressible statistician has been at work again, and his latest report is in regard to the increase in population in citizens and in the country. He claims that America has a total population of 6,000,000 in her 350 cities. A century ago there were but 100,000 in the cities showing the city population to have increased sixty fold.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

The present outlook is that President Cleveland will not veto the law creating the Department of Agriculture, but will either sign the bill or allow it to become a law by the ten days limit to lie in his hands without signing.

A proposition to attach the Weather Bureau and Signal Service Corps to the new department was defeated, but this action is not necessarily final, as congress may make the transfer at any time it sees fit after the new department has been put into operation.

We see no reason why President Cleveland should withhold his signature from the bill. The measure has been pending a long time; it has been thoroughly debated and discussed from every possible point of view.

The Telegram says to those Americans who are continually crying out against the ballot box frauds in this country is referred the following paragraph taken from the London Times. The Times in opposing woman's suffrage gives various reasons, among which is the paragraph referred to: "Considering the enormous number of

old women in male attire who already stuff the ballot boxes at every election, it is really most unreasonable to demand any further representation of the female element in society." Just think of it.

The attack on foreigners at Chin Kiang Foo is probably due to the priests or others who have made the ignorant Chinese believe that the tamine which has proved fatal to so many is the work of Europeans. There is no question that anti-foreign sentiment has been stimulated in China recently by those in authority, as the young Emperor is known to be very hostile to foreigners.

The punishment of crime by incarceration in prisons, is thought by very many, not to meet the ends to which it is designed, that is the protection of society and the lessening of criminal action. In Delaware the whipping post has been revived with the result, it is said, of decreasing crime, and it is argued that a general adoption of that kind of punishment would lead to good results in that direction.
