WHAT DO STRIKES ACCOMPLISH.

This question, though not immediately pertinent to our vicinity, is one of such broad significance and of such growing frequency and spreading tendencies, that it is demanding consideration and thought.

A calm and dispassionate view of the result will convince the thoughtful man that the good accomplished has never yet overbalanced the suffering and evil produced.

In the recent carmen's strike in Brooklyn and New York much distress was engendered, confusion produced, and two deaths caused.

One was that of a man who, being out of employment, took a place left vacant by the strike; the other was one of the men on strike who was one of a crowd that undertook to prevent a car from being run.

According to the testimony of the men themselves one leaped or fell to his death from the barn-loft in terror of the strikers who followed him, as he believed, to assault him; the other was shot dead by a policeman who was fighting single-handed against a mob.

Is it incorrect to ascribe these deaths to the managers of the road when they were plainly the results of the strike itself. The Irish World says: In order to fix the responsibility, therefore, for the tragedies of the strike we must not, if we desire to be just, allow our sympathies to attach all the blame upon the employers, who engaged new hands when old hands quit work, or upon the police authorities whose sworn duty it was to prevent obstruction of the streets and interference with public traffic and to promptly suppress at any cost all open violations of the public peace.

We must rather find out those who by counsel, sanction or example precipitated the repeated conflicts between the police and the crowds of strikers and their sympathizers. Were there a general feeling of assurance that new hands would not be assaulted, that the tracks would not be obstructed that the cars would not be smashed and overturned unless the lines were constantly guarded. Adams and McGowan might still be alive and the men would not have appeared in daily conflict with the police. The new hands could have been approached and reasoned with or even paid for remaining idle, for pay is usually preferred by such men for idleness rather than work. The officers, however, were unable to enforce such a policy, and the result was disorder, violence, police suppression, death, and defeat.

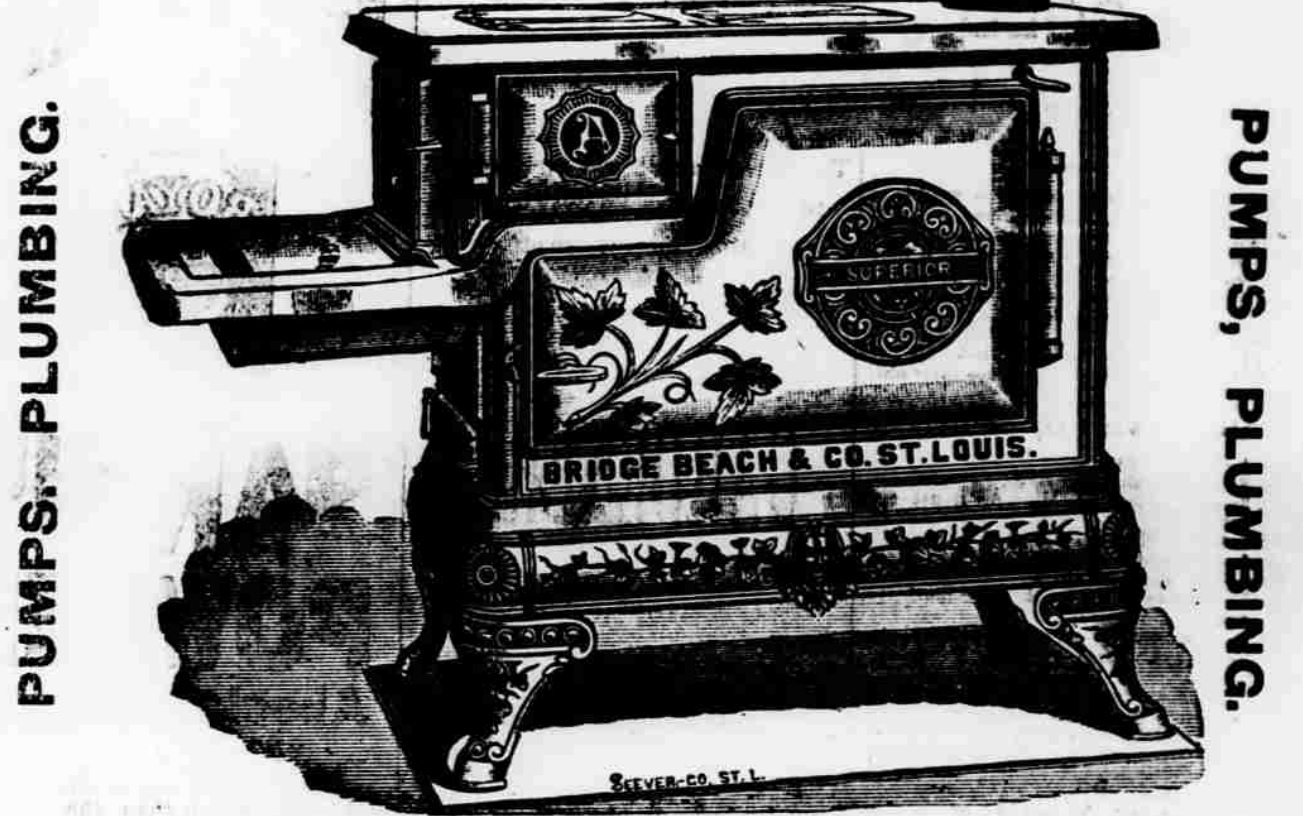
