Perhaps one of the most important measures for the Pacific coast, that has become assured by the President's signature to the bill, is the Nicaragua canal scheme, just completed by congress. It gives us the assurance of a successful water passage across the isthmus, which means a shorter route to market and promises that in the near future Pacific coast farmers will be relieved of the burden of paying for sacks to convey wheat in its cargo route, which is claimed to be essential under present arrangements. Admiral Anmen, the best posted man in the country says of this route: As located, every part of the work on the Nicaragua canal can be carried on without delay and with economy. The summit between the two oceans on the Nicaragua route is only 153 feet above low tide; the bottom of the lake is for the most part at sea level, and the surface of the lake, as it will be maintained, is 110 feet above the sea. This level will extend to within fifteen miles of the harbor of Greytown on the Atlantic side, and to within three miles of the harbor of Brito on the Pacific. Lying between these distances will be an uninterrupted waterway of 152 miles. The actual length of prism excavation will be less than twenty-nine miles, of which, when cleared of the forests, sixteen can be dug by dredges without rock or quicksand to embarrass the work. All of the essential conditions that insure success are fulfilled to a remarkable degree: 1. A superabundant water supply at the summit. 2. A surface drainage that assures immunity from floods. 3. Very great economy in construction. It is an established fact that the country is exceptionally healthy.

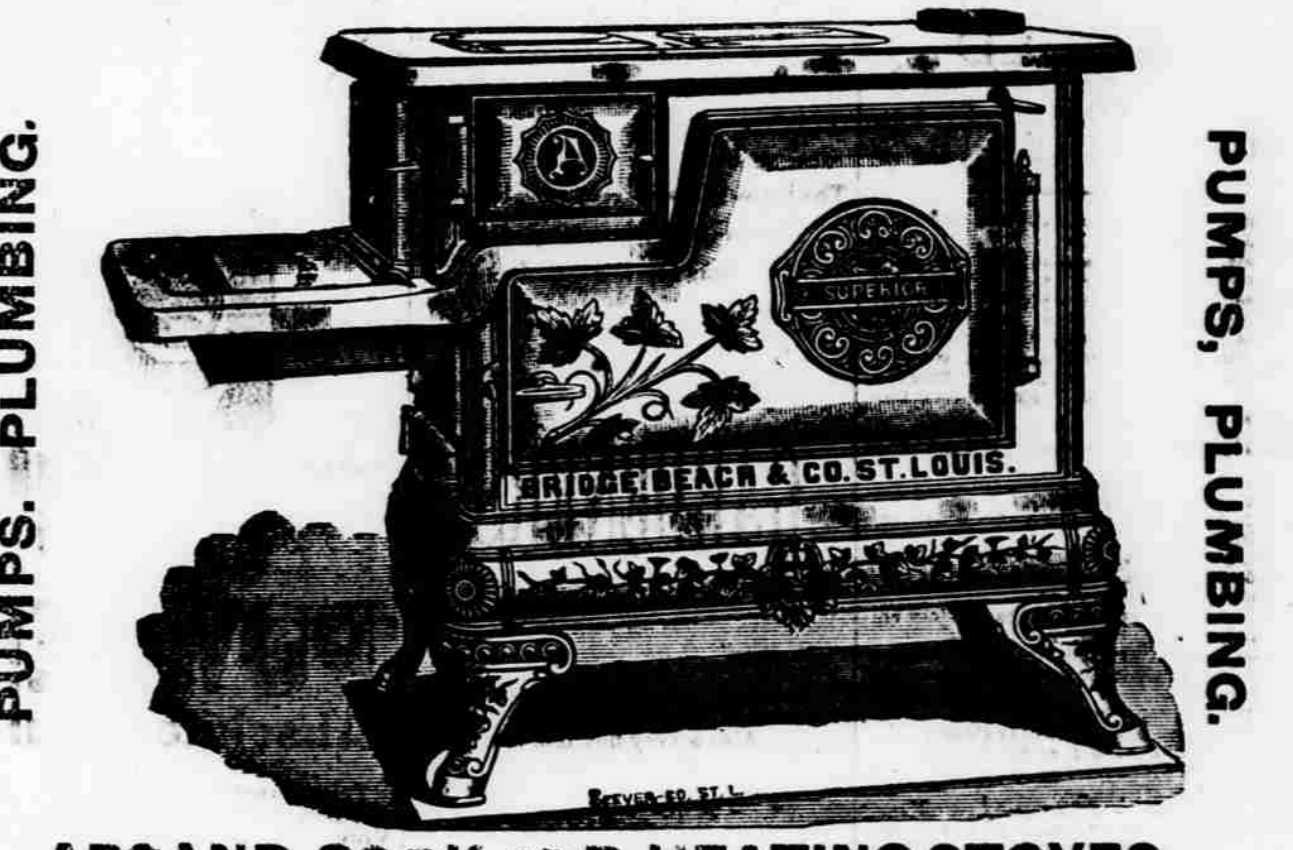
