YACQUINA BAY IMPROVEMENT.

The Status of the Government Works-The Appropriations, Etc. Intimately connected with the construction of the Oregon Pacific railroad eastward from this city, is the harbor at Yaquina bay.

It was thought that the funds available at the beginning of the year 1888 would permit an extension of six hundred feet to be made to the jetty during the year.

An examination made June 8, 1888, showed the channel to have a depth of about 25 feet. If the present project is carried out, an extension seaward of about 1500 feet will have to be made.

The Agricultural College. The State Agricultural College at Corvallis fared well this year, an appropriation of \$37,500 being made for it by the Cauthorn act.

Arrangements are being made by the young ladies' literary society of the Albany College to entertain a first-class and instructive entertainment at the opera house in about two weeks.

The notorious Jack Cooper, who is under indictment in Yamhill for stealing sheep, and who escaped from the county jail at Lafayette about two years ago, through the aid of confederates outside, has been again secured.
