WHAT ENGLAND THINKS.

There seems to be a diversity of opinion among the leading English papers...

The same journal doubts whether President Harrison's proposed new departure relative to the naturalization laws would be advantageous either for America or for the rest of the world.

Perhaps the most sensible comment is that of the Telegraph, which says that the fact that Mr. Harrison is so well disposed to deal with foreign affairs in a calm and equitable spirit will be remarked with satisfaction.

After all, what Great Britain thinks of the inaugural is of very little consequence. Half a century ago we were accustomed to wait for foreign opinion before expressing our own; but we have outgrown that, and the only sentiment we now have toward English opinion of American affairs is one of curiosity and nothing more.

The special appropriation authorized by congress for the protection of American interests on the Isthmus of Panama is a wise precaution.

The discharge of an army of laborers now employed on the ill-fated canal may occur any day, and scenes of violence and rioting may follow.

The naval forces have prudently been increased on each side of the Isthmus, but it may become necessary to remove a large body of American laborers, who will be left in destitute circumstances by the collapse of the enterprise.

In view of this contingency the appropriation has been increased from \$100,000 to \$250,000.

As other governments are taking similar precautions, it is probably that distress as well as bloodshed will be averted when the French paymasters exhaust their credit and discharge their workmen.

The United States government has guaranteed by treaty, "positively and efficaciously," the neutrality of the Isthmus, "with the view that the free transit from one to the other sea may not be interrupted or embarrassed."

The Bell telephone monopoly seems likely to come to an end through inventions that, by telegraphic devices, promises to supersede both the telephone and the telegraphic system now in use.

THE SCHOOL BOOK MONOPOLY.

The New Law Gives Them Full Sway for Six Years.

For ways that are dark and tricks that are vain commend us to the gigantic school book monopoly which is operating in Oregon, and now has the people of the state safely in their grasp for six years.

It will be remembered that the monopoly carried every point in the vote of county school superintendents for text books recently—that they succeeded in ousting the Brooks series of arithmetics and having adopted the Fish series instead, that they threw out a series of readers of their own for another series also published by themselves, and that they captured all the new books adopted—so that they stood in absolute possession of the field for four years, beginning in January.

But still they were not satisfied, and there was introduced in the house at the late session of the legislature a bill extending the time four years more, making it eight instead of four years, and this bill was amended so as to make the time six years, and passed and became a law.

This new law allows the directors in districts with 1000 and over pupils to "select text books for the high school only," and this provision will apply to two districts in the state, those of Salem and Astoria, and the Portland district is under a special law, and the Albany district falls a little short of 1000, having 909 scholars; but as this law only makes future rates for six years, but also extends the last rate (which was taken for four years) two years longer, it kindly relieves the directors of those two districts of even this slight burden.

The Salem Statesman, referring to this school book monopoly, sensibly says: This school book monopoly has over-jumped itself; it should have been satisfied with the whole hog for four years. Forbearance will sometimes cause to be a virtue on the part of the people of Oregon, and there will be an explosion, and this school book monopoly, with all of its paid agents, will be routed from the state.

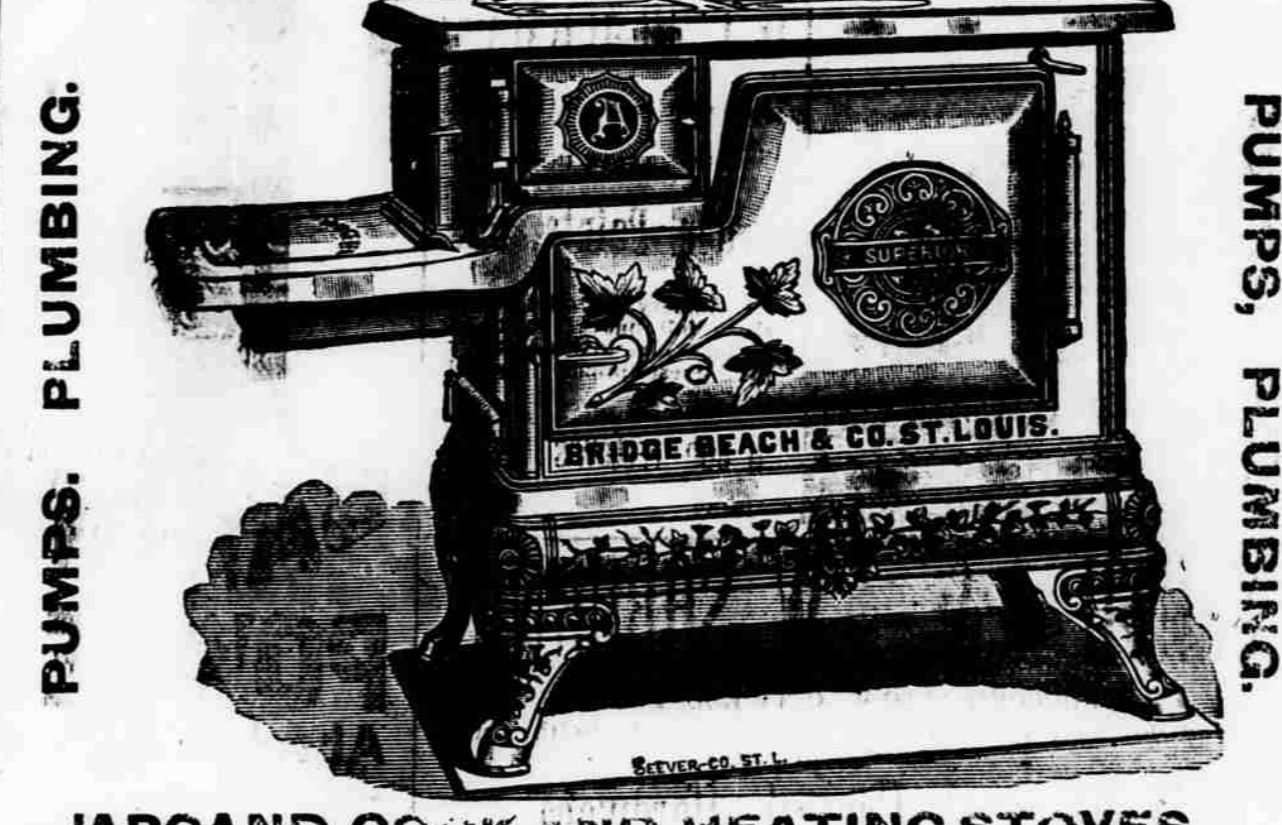
