Why is it that the farming community do not receive a just and adequate not receive a just and adequate compensation for their labor?

It takes but a cursory view of the transportation methods to show one discrepancy that leads to that end. When the railroads are allowed to charge as much or more for a car load of wheat from Tangent to Albany, a distance of six miles, as they do from Albany to Portland a distance of nearly ninety miles, it is plain that a discrimination against the former place is made that practically robs the producer of his profit. So also when the railroad will bring farm products from the Mississippi valley to Oregon at less rates than it will carry the same products tifty miles within the state, even a railroad official cannot help seeing that an unwarranted and unfair competition is established, that practically destroys the Oregon farmer's business. Yet these are approximately facts that are of everyday occurrence in the present L. FLINN, railroad transportation management, all over the country.

The question of how to control and correct these practices is the one to meet, and that has been answered in the past, and the answer is still reiterated, that it can only be accomplished by legislation. The inter-state commerce bill was passed for that purpose, as was our own railroad commission

Yet we find those who should-have the welfare of the farming community at heart, opposing the legislation looking to the correction of these practices.
