More Appointments Made By President Harrison.

THE NEW YORK POSTMASTERSHIP
An Army Officer to Be Tried by Court Martial—Stanley Coming Home With a Fortune in Ivory.

WASHINGTON, April 5.—The president has appointed Joel B. Ehrhardt collector of customs at New York.
Cornelius VanCott to be postmaster at New York.
Schuyler Bury, of Virginia, to be chief clerk of the patent office, vice Leipscomb, resigned.
Joel B. Ehrhardt, appointed collector of customs for New York by the president, was the republican candidate for mayor at the election last fall. The selection has no particular significance, as about all the leading republicans of the city favored his appointment.

STANLEY'S EXPEDITION.
He is Coming with a Big Fortune in Ivory.

BRUSSELS, April 5.—The report that H. M. Stanley and Emin Pasha are marching toward Zanzibar is believed in official circles here. Surprise is expressed, however, that Emin Pasha should abandon the lake provinces. Ivory in the possession of the party is estimated to be worth 3,000,000 francs.

A LETTER FROM THE EXPLORER.
LONDON, April 5.—The Royal Geographical Society has received a letter from Henry M. Stanley, the contents of which consist only of a report on the geographical exploration. The letter will be read at a meeting of the society Monday.

SAILED FOR SAMOA.
The Corvette Sophia Will Represent the U. S. at the Island.

WASHINGTON, April 5.—The German corvette Sophia, which sails from Zanzibar to-day for Samoa is another fine ship, superior to either the Adams or Alert, which will constitute the American squadron at Samoa. She is of a composite type, 14 knots speed, 2200 tons burden, carries eight 6-inch and two 3½-inch rifles, and four machine guns, with a torpedo outfit, and uses force, draft, which engineering experts here think contributed largely to the escape of the English war vessel Calliope, as it enabled her to get up steam in a short time.

TO BE COURT-MARTIALED.
Major Geo. A. Ames to be Tried for Disorderly Conduct.

WASHINGTON, April 5.—Major-general commanding the army has decided to recommend to the secretary of war that Major George A. Ames, retired, be tried by court martial on charges based on his conduct on inauguration day and his assault upon Governor Brewer.
