GERMANY has decided that she does not desire to provoke a war over the Samoan trouble and is willing to concede the rights claimed by the United States.

THE commissioners appointed to select a site for the navy yard on the Northwest coast of the Pacific, it is stated, have agreed upon a point on Puget Sound, between Seattle and Tacoma.

SECRETARY RUSK has issued a pamphlet giving a history of the agricultural experiment stations which have been established under the recent law of congress, and are now conducting scientific and practical experiments in regard to soil, tillage, manures, crops, stock raising, dairying and horticulture for the interior states.

ALL of the states and one territory, Dakota, now have agricultural experiment stations. The total number of stations now in operation is forty, and including the branch stations, nearly sixty.

THE most cordial feeling is said to exist between the stations and the department of agricultural, which is charged by congress with the duty of supervising and aiding the work of the stations.

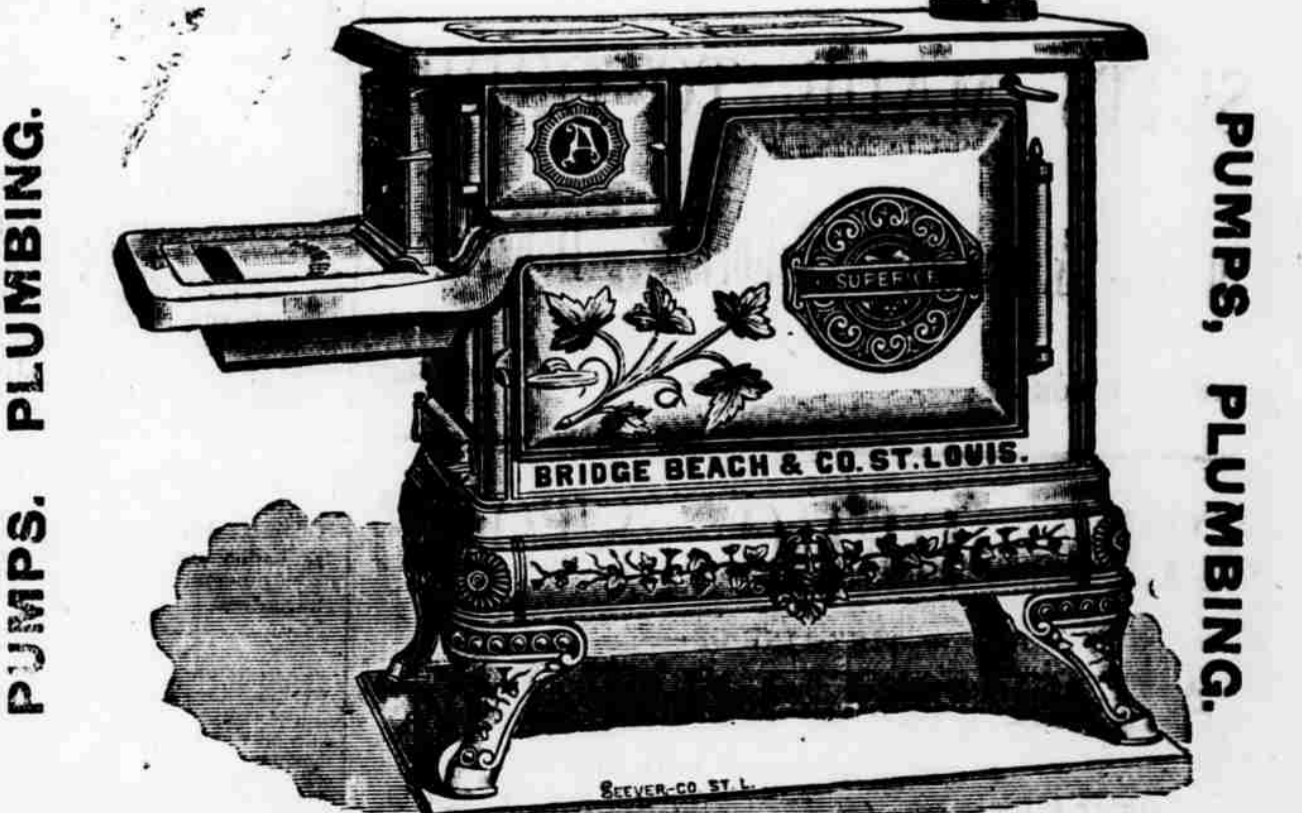
