TAKING THE CENSUS IN OREGON.

In taking the census of Oregon next year 240 enumerators will be employed. The state will be divided into two supervising districts, the summit of the Cascades being the dividing line. The work of enumeration will begin June 1, and must be completed by the latter part of that month. As Oregon is not a thickly settled state, the compensation of the enumerators will probably be the maximum prescribed by law—\$6 per day.
