THE THREE AMERICAS.

In 1881, Mr. Blaine, the then secretary of state, formally promulgated his plan for the creation of a commercial congress of American nations.

The adoption of uniform patent and copyright laws. The establishment of regular and frequent communication between the different countries participating in the conference.

The selection of a plan of settling international disputes. The adoption of a uniform silver coinage, and of a uniform standard of weights and measures.

The adoption of a uniform standard of customs and tariff duties. These are all important matters, but most important if considered together as links in a chain binding the people of this continent together with common purposes and mutual interests.

The effort consummated it is certainly worth making, especially as by failure nothing will be lost. Taken by itself, the most important subject to be discussed is that last mentioned, the adoption of a uniform standard of customs and tariff duties.

The question that naturally and inevitably presents itself at the start is, Is such an arrangement possible? The representatives of the various commercial bodies of Philadelphia met recently to consider the subject of a great exposition of the products of the three Americas, the United States, Canada, and the South American States.

The enormous value of the products of the latter was shown, the vast advantages which would accrue to this country from exchanging its manufactures for the productions of its Southern neighbors were made manifest, and it was urged that all these different peoples should be brought together at a great fair to be held at Washington in 1892, the four-hundredth anniversary of the discovery of America.

The consumption of sugar in the United States is fifty pounds to every man, woman and child. In Great Britain it is seventy-three pounds per head. Our total consumption is 3,000,000,000 pounds a year, so that a fraction of a cent a pound means a large sum to the sugar trust.

In order to provide amusement and recreation for the parish, a Baptist church at Wolverhampton, England, has built an annex to its chapel, in which is a billiard-room, a smoking-room and a bar for the sale of non-intoxicating liquor. The whole affair is controlled by the church officers and is well patronized and popular among the people.

there was one grand heap of indignation and disappointment at the small amounts awarded. To illustrate: C. S. Dick, one of Johnston's most popular citizens, lost \$5000 by the flood. Dick filed a claim for \$3000. His warrant was filled out for \$80. Dick was angry and refused to accept the amount awarded. A neighbor of Dick's, whose losses were much greater, also received a warrant for \$80. So it seems that this fund was treated as a sort of insurance fund by the people. But the committee disappointed them. Later information says the fund is to be applied to rebuilding. The public will wait with patience for a report from the Pennsylvania authorities.

CAPT. YOUNG, of the U. S. corps of engineers, in charge of the government work at Yaquina is being severely criticised for recommending the small appropriation of \$75,000 for Yaquina next year. There is \$45,000 left with which to prosecute the work on the jetties this year, and men deeply interested in the improvement of Yaquina harbor state that for next year the \$75,000 recommended will be needed and \$150,000 on top of it. This would deepen the channel sufficiently to enable deep sea vessels to enter, which is the end desired to be attained.
