HELD WITHOUT BAIL.

Examination of the Devils Who Wrecked the Overland Train.

TWO OF THEM CONFESS.

The Evidence at the Preliminary Examination Shows Three Men to Be Guilty of the Crime.

The preliminary examination of Wm. A. Hill, Fred and Herbert Rolfe, arrested on a charge of murder, for opening the switch of the Lebanon railroad branch, thereby wrecking the overland Southern Pacific train, and resulting in the death of the engineer, Jack Miller, was held in Justice Humphrey's court yesterday.

THE EVIDENCE.

The first witness introduced was Dr. W. H. Davis, who testified, as has already been published, that Hill came to him on Monday morning after the accident to have a dislocated arm set, and that while under the influence of chloroform he talked about having been with two other young men, who had wrecked the train on Sunday evening, and two days afterwards, on coming back to have his arm dressed, the doctor told him what he had said, when he made the confession which led to his arrest.

Thomas Logan, the fireman on the Lebanon train, testified that he saw no one about the switch Sunday night, but the next morning saw two men, supposed to be tramps, near Lebanon, lying beside the fence.

HELD WITHOUT BAIL.

This concluded the testimony on the part of the state. The prisoners waived the right to make a statement or introduce evidence, and the case was briefly argued by J. J. Whitney for the defendants and H. H. Northrup for the state.

The court held all three of the men without bail for murder. The prisoners are young men, the Rolfe brothers being about 19 and 22. Hill is probably 23 years old. They are all ignorant, tough looking fellows, and did not seem to realize the enormity of their crime, frequently laughing or grinning at the remarks of the witnesses.
