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BOUNDS OF INSANITY.

THE DEATH PENALTY.

The Chronicle refers to a recent hanging as follows: "The advocates of execution by electricity or some other sure and painless method were afforded yesterday another good example of the defects of hanging when at Louisville the rope slipped and one of two condemned men was caught under the chin. The deputies seized and dragged him up through the trap to the scaffold, where the wretched man asked what had happened. When told, he said, 'This shows I should not die; but die he did a moment later, when the bunglers had properly adjusted the noose. Such accidents as this are constantly liable to occur through the nervousness of the sheriff's assistance, and humanity demands that this worst of tortures should be made impossible by some system of execution that gives no chance for bungling.'"

Arguments without number spring up to prolong the death penalty, but a close analysis of all arguments of that nature will disclose the fact that they are the product of a predetermined prejudice in its favor, largely enhanced and perpetuated by the small spark of revengeful feeling engendered in human breasts against wrong doers, or engendered by personal injuries.

It is to be hoped that the collapse of the German sugar ring, which had gained control of eight million pounds of sugar, under an attempt to corner the market, and sold it to the sugar trust of this country under an arrangement to effect an entrance under a very low rate of duty by coloring the sugar to lower the grade, by which trick the government would have been swindled out of over a million dollars, will have some effect on cheapening the commodity in this country.

The new constitution under consideration in the convention of North Dakota is said to be a marvel of completeness, and to have been written by Wm. M. Everts of New York, for the consideration of \$500 paid by a number of wealthy non-resident land owners.
