To Abandon Fort Klamath.

The recent order of Secretary of War Proctor to abandon Fort Klamath stirred up a hornet's nest in Southern Oregon and telegrams protesting against this action have been received by Senator Mitchell. Many people of Linkville and Ashland sent dispatches protesting not only in the interest of the white inhabitants, but in the interest of the Indians on the Klamath reservation, and asked Senator Mitchell to request the suspension of the order until the people could be heard in the matter. He did so and has received telegrams from Adjutant-General J. C. Kelton and Brigadier-General Nelson A. Miles stating that the troops would be retained until the complaints of the citizens of Southern Oregon have been examined.


