THE OREGON PRESS ASSOCIATION.

A Profitable and Enjoyable Meeting of the Editors at Yaquina. Newport, Aug. 23.—In addition to the papers mentioned as being represented in the report sent yesterday, an arriving at Newport the Northwest Farmer, of Portland, the Oregon Preacher, of Albany, and several other papers were found represented.
