ENGLAND'S DECISION.

An Ottawa special to a Chicago Journal asserts that the Dominion Cabinet has received dispatches from London which say explicitly that the British government declines to allow the Pacific naval squadron to afford protection to Canadian sealers found in Behring sea.

The Canadian government, says the same journal, has been requested to prepare a schedule of damages claimed by the owners of the seized sealers, it being intimated in the advices received that negotiations are now in progress to effect a settlement of the difficulty by arbitration.

This will be good news, in one sense of the word, to our neighbors at Victoria, for now they can wash the war paint from their flushed faces and bury the hatchet, and can turn to the more congenial task of figuring out the cost to the United States government of sundry schooners and sealskins, in case the arbitration decides that our government is liable in damages for the seizures. They can shed rivers of ink instead of blood, and can sharpen their good gray goose-quills instead of tomahawks and scalping-knives.

But when this question comes to be agitated, as it undoubtedly will, the United States will have something to say about certain incidents which have occurred on the other side of the continent and upon the waters of another ocean. When Canada interposes her objections to the closed sea theory she will be asked how she reconciles that position with the headland-to-headland theory, and upon what ground she can object to our exclusive jurisdiction over the eastern half of Behring sea so long as she asserts exclusive control of open roadsteads and harbors on the Atlantic side. The questions at issue are so closely and intimately connected that it is reasonably certain the United States will insist upon having them heard and decided by the same arbitrators, and that is the best way to have the matter settled.

In the mean time the English government is showing its good sense and judgment by declining to interfere with the United States revenue vessels in Behring sea. The Canadian sealers had ample notice of what they might expect, and Great Britain very wisely refuses to defend them in face of the proclamation of the president. They took the risk, now let them get out of the scrape for themselves.

Some excitement has been created in San Francisco over the statement that Leong Hang Tsang, the Chinese consul-general at that port is to be made the defendant in a suit for \$24,000, to be instituted in the United States circuit court, by May Bock Hing, a Chinese contractor of Portland, Oregon. The consul-general has charge of the distribution of the money paid by the United States government to recompense the sufferers by riot and fire at Rock Springs, Seattle and other points. During the past three years the government has appropriated about \$400,000 for this purpose, and it is alleged that the consul-general has only paid over \$100,000, leaving a balance of \$300,000 unaccounted for. During the riots at Seattle in 1885 about 500 of May Bock Hing's laborers suffered losses of property at the hands of the rioters. Each Chinaman was afterward awarded \$50 indemnity by the government, and this money has never been over to the men, and the boss, it is stated, now seeks to recover the amount through the courts. In addition to this, complaints have been made and serious charges laid before the emperor himself and the Chinese government. In all probability the consul-general will be recalled, and should the charges be substantiated, his punishment will be death, as the Chinese government has a peculiar way of chopping off the heads of crooked officials, with very little ceremony in the way of a trial.

It is a good showing for Albany's manufacturing enterprise that these cars have been built at home in such an excellent manner.

LATEST returns estimate the American wheat crop of 1889 at 500,000,000 bushels, or nearly 85,000,000 bushels in excess of the crop of last year. This will leave not less than 150,000,000 bushels wheat for export. Last year the exports of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 121,000,000 bushels, notwithstanding the obstacles to the export trade that were created by speculative operations in the Chicago wheat pit.

The number of national banks is now 3,170, an increase of 54 in the past year. The increase has been mostly in the southwest. The capital invested in national banks is \$586,000,000. The surplus and profits of the banks are increasing at the rate of over \$10,000 a year.

The four territories, Washington, Montana, North and South Dakota will not become full states until they vote on and adopt state constitutions. This they will do on the first Tuesday in October.
