The milling showed about \$160 per ton. The 13th annual reunion of the pioneer society of Southern Oregon will be held at Ashland on Thursday, Sept. 12th, and an interesting time is expected.

Over \$15,000 in cash premiums is offered for agricultural, stock, dairy and mechanical exhibits, for works of art and fancy work, and for trials of speed. Running and trotting races will take place each day.

YAQUINA BAY.

Prospects for the Future and Present Activity of the Towns of the Bay. Oregon's pleasure resort is to be found at Newport, on Yaquina Bay, where all the elements for a watering place are found in pre-eminent profusion.

A beach for sunbathing as fine as the finest in the world; and drives to places of interest without number are among the attractions. The government jetties on both North and South Beach are immediately at hand, and if longer trips are wanted the South beach, without a rival in the world, can be had to Seal Rock, itself a resort second to none.

On the North beach is the light-house at Cape Foul-weather, and beyond both points are still further outlying attractions. Yaquina City, the Oregon Pacific terminus upon the bay, four miles above Newport with which it is connected by steamer making several trips per day, is finely located and growing in importance.

When the completion of the Oregon Pacific will induce the company to open the market for lots and building sites. Already syndicates have purchased lands around the bay at fabulous prices and are confident of a great city in the future.

Newport, proper, has been of slow growth, but it is a constant improvement, and points to the substantial future that surely awaits it no distant day. Far-seeing capitalists have invested in adjacent lands and building lots back of the city near the ocean beach commanding good figures.

Property on the water front that only a few years ago was offered for \$2,500 to \$5,000 now readily commands an offer of \$40,000. Portland capitalists are largely interested themselves in the place and the future outlook is good.

As a pleasure resort certainly Newport and Yaquina Bay with its environs has no peer. The Corvallis Firemen. The Corvallis Times says: Corvallis will probably send a hose team to the firemen's tournament at Tacoma next month.

They will begin practicing in earnest at once and hope to be able to make some showing among the professionals. East Portland will send a team composed principally of professional sprinters, including Jack Gillpin, Charles Weinberger, better known as Jack Gibson, and Eph Cameron. Tacoma will have a team of professionals, led by Harry Bethune, the American champion.

It would seem as if the Corvallis boys will be a trifle cheeky in entering such a contest, but our boys might surprise some of the flyers in other towns. Wheat. The price of wheat remains 63 cents in this city, and none is selling. The outlook of the markets of the world is certainly such as to induce farmers to hold for better prices.

There is a shortage in the old world and in India and Australia, which must be filled and the United States will be called upon to supply much of this wheat. The demand for the crop of this country should create good prices for wheat this fall. The outlook is certainly more promising than for several years, notwithstanding the present dull time of the markets.

Arrested for Abduction. At Corvallis Tuesday a warrant was issued by Justice Carlisle for the arrest of B. S. Harris, accused of abduction. The warrant was sworn out by Mrs. Estes, and accused the defendant of persuading her daughter Daisy to leave home. In the opinion of the justice the evidence was not sufficient to justify his binding the defendant over to await the action of the grand jury.

Fire in a Grain Field. Ubbe Peters living near this city attempted to burn up a pile of straw, when the fire spread into a considerable area before it could be put out. By hard work a hay baler and a quantity of hay was saved. The only damage was the burning of about 200 yards of fence. Mr. Peters had his face and hands slightly burned in putting out the fire.

In Good Trim. Engineer Wm. Miller has put the old hand engine in good repair and last evening it was thoroughly tested, showing that it was as good as ever. It will be sold and the proceeds will go to purchase an effective chemical engine. At the trial of the engine last evening she was handled by only about twenty men and threw a good, solid stream 165 feet. By being properly manned she will easily throw a stream 185 feet.

He was examined, and in default of bail sent to the county jail.

BADLY BURNED.

A Little Fish Can Engine Plays Haves With the Boy. Special to the Herald. HANNUSTON, Aug. 28.—Little Geo. Brandenberg late last evening while experimenting on an embryo steam engine constructed from an old tin can, met with a serious accident. He built a fire under the can, getting up a fine head of steam, when the can exploded, scattering the steam and hot water over him, scalding his face very badly.

COAST NOTES.

A large collection of valuable books have been received by the McMinnville college, and 400 additional volumes are daily expected. The Cottage Grove flour mill is running at its full capacity and turning out a fine quality of flour. It is receiving large support as a home industry.

Joshua Brown, aged 76, died at his home near Lewisville. He was a pioneer of 1852, and was very wealthy, leaving an estate valued at nearly \$100,000. During the present season McMurren & Crabill, proprietors of the Baker City planing mill, have shipped 114 carloads of lumber East, and are at present shipping two carloads per day. They ship to Utah, where they find a ready market.

Tillamook is having a prosperous, permanent and steady growth, resulting in a considerable degree from the rapidity with which the surrounding country is being settled. The improvements now in construction are valued at \$75,000. The saw and planing mills are working under full force.

Friday morning "Jinks" Montgomery, of La Grande, was examining a pistol of about 32 caliber, which was supposed to be empty. Some way the hammer got caught and he hit it a tap against the side of the head to make it go down. It went down all right enough, and the pistol was discharged in Montgomery's face, the ball entering by the side of the right cheek bone.

Heppner is the nearest point to the Dayville settlement, whose stockmen possess, in the aggregate not less than 100,000 head of sheep. An extension of the Heppner-Haystack road to Dayville means an addition of 1,000,000 pounds of wool for the Heppner market. The Dayville people will subscribe to within a few hundred dollars of the amount required to build the road, and Heppner will come up with the remainder.

From twelve to fourteen men are employed in the logging camp of the Willamette Pulp and Paper Company, situated one and one-half miles below Wheatland on the east side of the Willamette. From 12,000 to 15,000 feet of cottonwood logs are daily being put in the river. The intention is to have several rafts of logs in the paper mill basin by September 15, ready for the grinders. As the men at the camp is equal to that of a high-toned hotel the men are laying on flesh.—Courier.

The corps of engineers under E. E. Cooper, of Corvallis, surveying the line from Astoria to Forest Grove, has reached about thirty miles from Astoria, making now about a mile a day, and has succeeded in getting over the mountains with a grade of fifty-two feet to the mile, by combining the former surveys up the Lewis and Clarke rivers, crossing to the west of Saddle mountain to the Willard survey of 1883. From now on it will be comparatively easy work until they reach the head of Nehalem valley. The Habersham party, which is surveying the Astoria & South Coast railroad, is at present working on Nekanicum creek, but have not fixed upon any final grade yet, and expects to survey to Tillamook. Both parties of surveyors will complete their work by October 1.
