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THE SUNDAY QUESTION.

There is perhaps no other question that will engage as universal a discussion, in the near future, as the one that forms the title of this article. It is sought to make it a subject of general legislation which will of a necessity bring it before the public.

The final decision will in all probability be founded upon the utilitarian view of the case, leaving out all questions of theology, and will accord a closer observance of the day than is even now given it, thus tacitly acknowledging the divine wisdom of the command to observe one day in seven as a day of rest.

Perhaps as good an example of the argument upon the subject can be found in the following from the Denver News: "Any effort to associate religion with legislation in this country, beyond the present ample constitutional guarantees, is unwise and will encounter a measureless resistance. The mixture of church and state in any way is abhorrent and in the mind of the unbiased student of history is inseparable from the details of a thousand years of human carnage and wretchedness. Moreover, the association is degrading and demoralizing to religion, and the best friends of religion should dread it most. Who can point to any country where the various types of Christianity have the vitality and thrift that they show in the United States? With ten new churches coming into existence each day in the year under a strictly secular government, the clergy should realize the possibility of things being much worse than they are. Unless the people of the United States can agree in establishing one day in the week as a day of rest from ordinary labor, the probability is that in the end there will be little attention paid to any day, except by the people who may keep Sunday for religious reasons. The trouble is that the perpetual and consuming business activity that marks our age will sweep the bulk of the industrial population into the vortex of a perpetual grind, that will inevitably entail physical degeneracy. Protection is needed against the cupidity and the thirst for acquiring riches that never in history has characterized human nature as it does to-day. In Continental Europe two million toilers are wearing themselves away in an endless whirl, strangers to the rest demanded by the laws of nature, and in most cases they are slaves to the power that dooms them to such an existence. If they decline to work seven days they have the choice of not working at all. It will be a bad thing for this country if we adopt the Continental Sunday. The question is of deep interest to our laboring population. There is soon to be a demand for a shorter day, that the aggregate of work may employ more workers. The principle is equally applicable to Sunday, in addition to the acknowledged physical requirements of man for a day in which to recuperate. "No Sunday work that is reasonably avoidable," should be a vital motto with every labor organization in the United States. A civil Sunday based upon physical and philosophical reasons and conceived in a spirit broad enough to recognize and respect the rights of all, would be an institution of inestimable importance to this republic. It would be favorable to the progress of religion, because if there was a general cessation from unnecessary labor a great many who now have to work could go to some church if they felt disposed to do so; but if they preferred to enjoy their day in some other way, their right should be equally sacred, provided they interfered with the worship, rest, or enjoyment of no one else and violated no law."
