A DIFFERENCE.

Perhaps as suggestive a circumstance as has occurred lately was the sending of fifty American workmen, to make the tour of Europe. They have returned and are more contented with their lot because of the comparison made on the other side of the ocean. They agree, without dissent, that the American workmen is better paid, better housed, better fed, better clothed and generally better off than his European fellow. They agree, too, that in machinery and appliances the United States is far ahead of Europe, and that the most of their processes are crude as compared with ours.

The Chronicle thinks that it would be a curious experiment for Great Britain or France or Germany to send half a hundred of its workmen to America on a similar tour of inspection and observation. They could be assured a cordial welcome and a most hearty reception. They would be, to all intents, the guests of the American people, and every opportunity would be afforded them for the study of our industrial systems and comparison with their own.

The consequences of this action on the part of European workmen it further thinks would be that about forty-nine out of the fifty would not be contented until he had made his way to the United States. The things of which our workmen boast—better food and shelter and clothes and wages—would appeal so strongly to them as to make them more than willing to leave their native land and remain in this country.

European workmen are already, in a measure, apprized as to the advantages of this country for them which accounts for the enormous immigration to this country of that class of people.

THE REVENUE BUSINESS.

Our neighbors upon the north have a due appreciation of our governmental affairs, and sometimes an appreciation of the situation verging upon facts. The Canadian Manufacturer, speaking upon the revenue business says: "The receipts of the United States last year were \$388,000,000, of which \$235,000,000 were from customs duties. This would leave \$153,000,000 as derived from internal revenues. The expenditures of the government were \$283,000,000, or \$55,000,000 more than what was derived from customs duties. In other words, all the income derived from customs duties was required for the expenditures of the government and \$58,000,000 besides. The receipts from internal revenue are derived chiefly from taxes upon whisky and tobacco, and it is clearly to be seen that if this latter tax were removed, or reduced to the extent of \$105,000,000, the receipts and the expenditures of the government would be equalized. It should be understood that while the United States government imposes taxes upon whisky and tobacco, it does not license the manufacture or sale of them, for it does not have the power under the constitution to do so. But the states have this power, and some of them use it, and the Federal government can raise no objection to any action the states might take looking to the prohibition or regulation of these trades within their borders. Internal revenue laws never were and never will be popular in the United States, and when any material reduction of the receipts at the treasury is made, it will be effected by removing or modifying the internal revenue taxes, not by abandoning the protective feature of the Tariff laws."

The organization of the Union party at Salem last Saturday, according to programme, by reference to the proceedings of the convention given elsewhere will be seen to consist of the prohibition party under a new name only. Probably the opinion expressed very emphatically by several of the leaders of the prohibition party, that it was a mistake to drop the old name, will be found to be correct. The effort to draw in other elements to strengthen the third party movement is apparent, but will not be conducive of harmonious work, for incongruity cannot produce harmony.

SOMETIMES part of a story gives an entire different view of facts than does the whole story, truthfully told. An English exponent recently boasted that up to July 31st of this year the English exports of cotton cloths had exceeded those of the previous two years, for the same period, by five per cent. The critic demolished the boast, however, by showing that although England had really exported one hundred million yards more of cloth during the first seven months of 1889, the exporters actually received £300,000 less for them than for the smaller quantity exported in 1888. Thus the full particulars gives an entirely different phase to the matter than what the reporter intended it should.

The Pullman car porter who risked and lost his life to save his passengers from the assault of a robber, redeems very much of the lost faith in humanity. The gibes against his class will be lost much of their caustic severity in memory of his meritorious deed.
