It is said that prospective successor of Leo XIII as Pope of Rome, will be Mgr. Sigliara, who is a native of the Island of Corsica.

The Lick Observatory, with its immense telescope, in California is pushing forward the cause of science in a wonderful degree, and will undoubtedly cause our sister state to take rank among the foremost in such matters.

Two footpads recently halted B. H. Hutchinson, better known as "Old Hutch" the great manipulator of the grain markets in Chicago, and demanded his money or his life. He promptly raised his hands and allowed them to go through his pockets. They found nothing and he enjoyed the joke.

SEVERAL fires in hop houses in different parts of the state are reported, causing more or less damage. Great care should be used in handling the hop crop in dry houses, for there must be danger at the best, but probably nine-tenths of the fires could be traced to the careless use of matches by cigarette, cigar or pipe smokers.

SUICIDE seems to be contagious by example. Last winter Miss Winner of Keene, and Miss Walker of Springfield Vermont, committed suicide. A few days ago Miss Be-la Walker of Bellows Falls, Vermont, a friend of the young ladies mentioned, followed their example and took her own life.

The sympathy of the public will be accorded Miss Laura Graulich, of San Francisco, who finding her affianced was departing with a dive waitress, and subsequently that he had left a wife and children in the east, upbraided him with two shots from a revolver, and the belief will be strong that if she had made the shots fatal, her act though not to be approved could have been condoned.

The schoolboys in Eugene City have a summary way of disposing of legal questions relating to the school house property. Some one had claimed a portion of the school house lot, and during the vacation had fenced it in. On the school assembly the boys disposed of that fence in short order.

Even the genius tramp is redeeming himself. One of that gentry recently ran three miles to inform a telegraph operator that a broken rail endangered a passenger train, and when the imperfectly working wires would not allow the operator to warn the train in season, helped to pump a handcar back to the broken rail in time to flag and save the train.

FARMERS FRIEND says that some of the government statisticians at Washington are indulging in esti-

mates as to what the census of 1890 will show the population of this country to be. It has been partly developed by experience that the ratio of increase from one census to the next (a period of ten years) is about 30 per cent. To these are added what are called by the statisticians, "variable elements," to wit: Annexation of territory, immigration, etc. These, it is estimated, will be a fraction over 4 per cent. The birth rate over the death rate is assumed to be 3.01 per cent. From the general basis line thus outlined, it is estimated that the census taken in June next will show that the United States has a population of 67,710,293.

On the subject of poisonous plants the New York Independent says that most people know that the common oleander of our gardens is a very poisonous plant; and there is every reason to believe that the poisonous honey so often referred to by ancient writers came, if from anywhere, from its flowers. The whole botanical family to which it is related—Apocynaceae—is more or less poisonous. It has recently transpired that one of the most poisonous plants of Central Africa is the Strophanthus, a genus of plants closely related to the oleander. The poison is a valuable article of commerce with the natives, and is gathered chiefly in the district just below the Murchison Falls. It is a strong, woody, climbing plant, reaching to the tops of tall trees.

The struggle among humanity is to see which will reach the top and remain there. In the invention and use of war implements this is exemplified perhaps better than in any other avocation. No sooner is an effective destroyer made than its action is guarded against by some equally as effective device. An example of this counter work is found in a remarkable torpedo-boat that has just been introduced into the French navy. It is much smaller than the ordinary torpedo-boat, and very light. The torpedo is carried outside, attached to the hull of the boat, but disengageable at the will of the captain. On the bow is a pair of curved scissors about three meters in length, their use being to enable the boat to cut her way through nets or the connection wires of submarine mines. It is proposed to use electricity as the motive power.
