THE INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS.

As the time draws near for the assembling of the delegates of the various North and South American governments, at Washington, in a conference congress, the initiative of which was inaugurated by our government, the scheme is attracting attention and remark.

Some of the European governments are betraying alarm over the action that may arise in that conference, fearing that the United States may gain a commercial supremacy. A French writer attacks it as an action directly towards that end, and commences a wordy war against the conference on that ground.

As the Chronicle remarks the truth about the international congress is that its work will be largely evolutionary in its character. Its decisions cannot be binding upon the nations represented there, for it is only a conference, not a legislative body, and all it can accomplish in reality is an interchange of ideas and a formulation of plans to be submitted to the respective governments for approval.

It is sincerely hoped that the question of transportation may receive due attention and that the views of the conference may have weigh with congress in the matter of aiding American steamship lines; but as to the question of an international customs union, the French writer referred to is probably unnecessarily alarmed and is speaking from his fears rather than from his knowledge of the subject.

The importance of this conference is not confined to any commercial advantages, that may have been in the minds of some of the instigators of the plan. It has a far greater significance, and its planners may have builded even better than they knew. It broadens and strengthens that phase of governmental policy that leads to the settlement of national difficulties or misunderstandings by arbitration instead of a resort to arms.

It is a leading and active agent towards bringing about that era in human affairs when war, carnage and bloodshed shall be unknown, and peace reign supreme throughout the earth.

An apparently careful estimate in the Pacific Rural Press of the wheat and barley crops for this year makes the yield of the former 30,311,603 centals, and of the latter 9,751,247 centals. Not a bad output for a state whose most advanced agricultural thinkers persist in putting cereals in the second place when discussing the future of agriculture in California.

The man in the moon is in imminent danger. It is said that a German scientist wishes to determine, by means of photography, if the moon is inhabited, and it is said that the King of Wurtemberg has decided, in order to solve this interesting problem, to cause to be made, in the best possible condition, photographs of the moon; then to enlarge the negative 100,000 times.

The will of the late Prof. Loomis, the author of one of the leading series of mathematical text books of our country, bequeaths the bulk of his estate valued at \$250,000 to \$300,000, to the Yale University. This is the second largest gift ever made to Yale. After various small bequests the will provides that the bulk of the Professor's books and pamphlets, manuscripts, engravings, curiosities and household furniture go to Henry B. Loomis of Seattle W. T. and all of the remainder to Yale, in trust. That one-third of the income from this trust be given to Henry B. Loomis

one-third to Francis E. Loomis, now traveling in Europe, and the other third to the Yale Observatory.

It will be remembered that a few weeks ago the dispatches related how the natives of Morocco had captured the crew of a Spanish vessel and sold them into slavery in the interior. Chronicle says that the Spanish government is taking steps to properly resent the affront, and we may hear in a short time that the skins of some citizens of Morocco have been properly tanned. It is a long while since Spain has asserted herself in a vigorous fashion, but that is no reason for believing that she means to remain quiet indefinitely. She has a good navy, and could knock smithereens out of the practical natives of the north coast of Africa if she started on the job.

The former homes of the cliff dwellers, situated in section 4, township 36 north, range 17 west of the New Mexico meridian in the state of Colorado, are to be withdrawn from disposal until an examination of the same can be held with a view of ascertaining their condition and historical value, and steps are to be taken to protect the ruins from wrongful removal or destruction.

A South Norwalk, Conn., justice of the peace, recently summed up the evidence submitted to him and sentenced a six year old boy to prison, in the house of correction, for 15 years. That justice would furnish some modern Shakespeare a greater travestied farce upon justice than did Dogberry to the original Shakspeare.
