LYNCH LAW ATROCITIES.

A careful consideration of the circumstances leading to, and the results of all cases of mob law lynchings, will convince the most rabid stickler for rapid justice, that the lynch law business does not pay; that in nine cases out of ten the results are bad instead of good, and that the leaders and active participants in these demonstrations would give years of their lives if they could wipe out their part in the transactions.

Take for instance the recent Kansas transaction. The first telegraphic phase of the circumstance, was that Henry Bloomer and his wife, while working in the fields, left their three year old child in the care of Mrs. Rosalia Edwards. On returning from their work the child could not be found, and Mr. and Mrs. Edwards could or would give no satisfactory reason for its disappearance. A mob was collected and by hanging the woman until she was nearly dead, a confession was extorted from her that, in a moment of passion at some trivial offence of the child she had killed it and her husband had concealed its body in the creek.

With that version of the affair the almost universal comment would be "immediately hang both the man and the woman." But when the facts are all brought out it seems that the confession wrung out a fragile and highly nervous woman was entirely false, probably but an unconscious assent to language put to her by the leader of the mob and the outgrowth of his imagination. After the woman had been twice subjected to the hanging process, and only saved from actual death by the plea of the father of the missing child to save her life until the body of the child was found, and the husband had been repeatedly hung until life was almost extinct, the mob was induced to allow the accused to be placed in jail, still clamoring for their lives.

Subsequent search reveals the child alive, uninjured and happily sporting on a neighboring farmers doorstep, where it had been taken without the knowledge or consent of the accused husband and wife, and they were as innocent and unaware of its whereabouts as were any of the mob who were torturing them to death.

The incident carries its own moral and should speak in tones loud enough to reach all over this country, and give out a warning to every person who has the least inkling towards a mob movement, to pause and consider, and use his efforts to wards bringing law breakers to legal trial, and have nothing to do with mob violence.

The safety of the people lies in the supremacy of the law, and these lynching parties are but so many active agents in bringing the law into disrepute. They are almost invariably but an active ebullition of that attribute of human nature denominated vengeance, and of which it is proclaimed that it belongs alone to deity.

COUNT HARTZFIELD the German prince, of whom there has of late been considerable gossip in relation to a supposed marriage he was endeavoring to contract with an immensely wealthy American girl, was recently re-married to his divorced wife. The American girl will have to hunt some other titled European to endow with her checkers.

REPUBLICANISM in governmental affairs grows constantly in favor. The government of the people, by the people and for the people has come to stay. Boulangists and imperialists in France have for months intimated that such was

not the case and that the old order of affairs was to supplant the republic in that country, but the recent election speaks in a different tone and Boulangists and imperialists can retreat into their dens, for the sun of the republic shines brighter than ever. Progress never goes backward.

The keeping of vicious dogs is a most reprehensible action on the part of any person. The practice received a fair illustration in the city of Racine, Wis., recently where a vicious bull dog attacked and mangled a nine year old boy, and also severely wounded two men who went to the rescue of the boy. The boy will die. Probably the owner of the canine stood back viewing the situation with satisfaction, thinking "it is pretty rough on the victims but it will be the making of a pup." The pup and its owner ought, in justice, to be hung to the same limb by the separate ends of the same rope.

The First National bank of Denver appears to have been the victim of very successful swindlers. The receiving and paying tellers were both defrauders and absconders, leaving the bank over twelve thousand short on their accounts. Some months ago a robber gained admission to the president's private office and at the muzzle of a revolver induced him to make out a draft for \$21,000 and have it cashed immediately, and the robber disappeared with it leaving no trace behind. All is not happy sunshine in the banking business.

The death of Wilkie Collins, the English novelist, takes from the reading world a writer of fiction who ranked with Dickens, Thackeray and the other English writers. Many will be pained to learn of his death, for American readers were partial to his books.
