BRITISH SYNDICATES

Some of the financiers of this country have been somewhat exercised recently over the investment of British capital in manufacturing in the United States, but now comes the statement that the Britishers are actually going to try over again what they failed to do many years ago, to take this country.

This time it is with British gold which is mightier than English armies. The dispatches tell us that two gigantic syndicates with \$50,000,000 capital have been formed in Chicago and will buy up everything in sight that will pay twelve per cent on the investment.

This report is no doubt exaggerated somewhat, but it is certain that such syndicates have been formed, and their scope can only be determined after time has elapsed to show how they are prepared to do business in competition with the shrewd Yankee of this country.

The syndicates include in their membership a great number of British bankers and trustees of large estates in the United Kingdom. No business was acquired for them in the United States which has not paid at least 12 1/2 per cent a year for the past five years.

Grain elevators, flouring mills and breweries have been the favorite investment. The management of each of the various enterprises will be placed in an American board of directors, subject to the control of the London.

The representative of the syndicate when asked if this did not look like the establishment of a huge British trust, said no; each enterprise will be operated separately. The plan is not one of aggression, but conservative investments.

Hostile legislation, it is learned, has been cleverly evaded in a careful manner. The deal embraces a chain of elevators from the Minnesota and Dakota wheat districts to Chicago. The syndicates' flouring mills are at Minneapolis and breweries in Chicago and the East. The purchasing committee, it is understood, left Chicago en route to the Northwest, and intended to go from there to Omaha and Kansas City, where further purchases are now being considered. Among the properties already turned over to the syndicate are a number of breweries in Chicago, Albany, Detroit, Newark, Jersey City, New York, Baltimore, Rochester and Syracuse. Also the Star elevators in Minneapolis, seventy-six in number; the Van Driessen system of elevators of Rochester, Minneapolis, ninety in number; Cargill Bros' elevators of Minneapolis and Dakota.

There has been enough bluster, war-like demonstrations and threats among the nations of Europe during the past year to kill off two-thirds of the would-be blood-thirsty people of the old world if such threats were carried into execution. And now comes the report that the Russian government intends to raise a large internal loan, as a means of obtaining sufficient financial means to carry out its gigantic plans in anticipation of war. The money to be secured by this means will it is said be devoted altogether to military and naval purposes. This step is contemplated in view of the uncertainty of the French alliance, which renders it difficult for Russia to

raise funds outside her own borders. At least 70,000,000 rubles will be expended in strengthening the navy. The remainder will be devoted to increasing the frontier fortifications and to the purchase of magazine rifles. These measures in addition to the new railway connections on her western frontier, are believed among the powers to indicate a well-defined purpose of making war at no very distant date. When it comes to the actual fighting point, however, there is little danger of much of it being done. The modern engines of war are so complete that whole armies could be mowed down in a day and none of the nations hanker after a real war.

The Washington correspondent of the St. Paul Pioneer-Press has just returned from a trip through the West, chiefly in the new states. He has been making a careful observation of affairs in the new states, and says that he does not think the democrats have any chance to get anything out of the October elections except in Montana. There he thinks they will elect the governor, and if there is perfect harmony in the party they will get the legislature, but he has no doubt that the republicans will elect the representatives.

The alleged riot at Brownsville over the "holiness" revivalists seems to have been somewhat exaggerated. The rioters did tear down the tent but no property was destroyed, no one was seriously hurt, and no arrests were made by the sheriff. The holiness crowd have made themselves very obnoxious to the people of Linn county generally, and have been driven out of one or two places by indignant citizens who would not be imposed upon.
