IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON, you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint of the plaintiff above named against you in the above entitled cause now on file with the clerk of the above entitled court, on or before the first day of the next regular term of said court, to-wit: the 28th day of October, 1889, and you are hereby notified that if you fail to appear and answer said complaint as hereby required the plaintiff will take judgment against you for the sum of \$500.00, and interest thereon from the 15th day of August, at six per cent, per annum, and for the costs and disbursements of this action, and for an order made by the application of the plaintiff, to-wit: That the sum of \$250.00 be paid to the plaintiff out of the proceeds of said judgment.
