THERE appears to be a strong sentiment, growing in proportions throughout the country, that the election laws should be amended. The adoption of the so called Australian system of voting is called for from many sources. The object to be gained by the adoption of this system is primarily to remove the elector from all danger of intimidation. Of course with that object in view the supposition is that there is intimidation, or at least personal influence exerted to carry out the terms of bargain and sale of votes. But is such the case to any extent? Speaking of California, and of course applicable to all other localities, the Chronicle

says that "experience, however, demonstrates that this is an unwarranted assumption. A little anecdote told at one of the clubs will illustrate this thoroughly. The man who tried it on told the joke, although it was on himself. We call it a joke, because he seemed to disagree with the statutes which defines his attempt to be a crime. It was during the new constitution fight. He was looking after a certain precinct, and had "fixed" 152 votes "against the new constitution." He had a man hired to watch the voters go to the polls and drop in the tickets which were furnished to them. Strange to say when the vote was counted that night there were exactly sixty-one votes against the new constitution, and the presumption is that they were cast by others than those who were "fixed." The relator of the story believes that every one of his "fixed" men beat him, and he is probably right. The man who cannot vote as he pleases under the California system is a stupid fellow, and does not deserve to exercise the right."

The new constitution of the state of Washington is endowed with one very excellent provision. It is the section that requires every voter to be a citizen of the United States. In other words, foreigners must reside in the state the full five years required to become citizens, and cannot be transformed into voters by grinding out declaratory papers for them a day or two before election. This will render the occupation of vote manufacture a more precarious one than it has been under the practice of piling up majorities from the easily controlled foreigner before he has learned to think for himself.
