JUSTICE TO ALL.

The difference between corporate
institutions and individuals, as far
as governmental treatment is con-
cerned—and indeed as far as treat-
ment from all quarters is concerned—
is pretty well illustrated in land
grant business and in the deferred
payment of bonds of the Pacific
railroads given for money advanced
by the government for their con-
struction...

Again if an individual enters into
an obligation to repay borrowed
money, he is rightfully expected,
to meet and fulfill that obligation.
The Central and Union Pacific rail-
roads were furnished the means to
build their roads by the govern-
ment and gave their bonds for pay-
ment...

On this subject the Chronicle
gives a hint of a result that would
not be entirely unacceptable by the
people. It says "the subsid-
ized Pacific railroads say that if the
government required them to pay
up when the bonds mature they
could not possibly do so, and that
they would be compelled to sacrifice
the roads. This is in the
nature of a threat, and has been
made under the impression that
public sentiment in the United
States would not approve of the
government taking hold of and
running railroads. The smart men
who conceived the idea entirely
overlooked the fact that another
course is possible, namely, to pro-
ceed to foreclose, and if the roads
should by any possibility be thrown
up, as threatened, to take them
and lease them to the highest and
best bidders. The men who have
abused the generosity of the govern-
ment in the fashion that the
managers of the Central and Union
Pacific roads have should not be
granted any further favors."

THE REASON WHY.

The rumors of European wars, to
be, are semi-occasionally spread
over the world, and the people
often think it strange that the
clouds are so quietly dispelled.
The New York Commercial Adver-
tiser tells us the most potent rea-
son for it that has yet been al-
luded to, when it says that the observers
of European politics are apt to for-
get one very important considera-
tion, which wards off the breaking
out of international war. The
belligerently disposed nations are
nearly all bound together by close
and peculiar business relations—
Russia owes a handsome little for-
tune to Germany, France and Eng-
land. If wars break out, where
is Russia to borrow money to pay
its war bills? Even in peace the
Chair's financiers can not make
both ends meet. The German and
English bankers, who have plenty
of friends at court, are quite as

acutely interested in the matter.
The prosperity of Russia is their
only security for the payment of
what Russia already owes them.
They have a serious and very
proper business objection to seeing
their own friends burn down
Russia's towns and destroy her
productive laborers. France, Italy
and Belgium have long been en-
gaged in a business partnership to
maintain the value of silver.
Enormous sums of Italian and
Belgian silver coinage are circulat-
ing in France, and under the part-
nership agreement each nation, in
case the Latin union be dissolved,
must redeem in gold half its silver
coinage circulating in the other
states. The penalty is so heavy
that Italy will think more than
twice before it breaks off its friend-
ly relations with France. Finally,
there is that chronic bore of Eu-
rope, the Turkish Sultan, who
owns money everywhere, but particu-
larly in England. No matter
who wrests away Constantinople
from the Sultan, it is of course
assured that when that august
sovereign loses the city he will go
into permanent bankruptcy; and
not only that, but somebody else
will walk off with the collateral.
There are sometimes great advan-
tages in getting men whose im-
pulses run away with them into
the hands of the money-lenders.

The matter of admitting Idaho
as a state seems to be permeated
with the same difficulties that
attend the admission of Utah,
namely the strength of the Mormon
church in the territory, and the
danger, after the admission, of the
assumption of power by the Mor-
mons, and the real coalescing of
church and state. It is true that
the proposed constitution contains
an anti-polygamy clause, but when
once the state government is
formed that clause can be easily
emasculated, if the Mormons are
in the ascendancy, of which condi-
tion there seems to be real danger.

The indications are that the next
congress will use strong efforts to
abolish the internal revenue sys-
tem.
