WHO IS COMPETENT TO WRITE A WILL

The Judge of the Orphan's Court of Allegheny, Pennsylvania, recently rendered a decision refusing to allow a claim for writing a will by a man who was not a lawyer.

In commenting upon this decision, the Farmers Friend of Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, says, with considerable force and no small foundation of truth: "Bah! the records of the courts show that the great bulk of wills that have caused litigation have been prepared by lawyers. Even so great a lawyer as Samuel J. Tilden failed to write his own will so as to keep his estate out of the courts."

DOES FARMING PAY?

The pessimistic view taken of the husbandman's occupation by a great many, happily is not harbored by all. For instance the Indiana Farmer actually thinks that farming does pay. Here is the way he puts the case: "Farming cannot be quite so poor a business as some of our correspondents would have us think. We hear of no failure in it, and we know of many farmers who are making money. Further than this, we know that farmers have no difficulty in borrowing money, if they need it for improvements. Bankers are very careful to whom they loan their money; they do not take many risks with it, and they are less afraid of the farmer than most other customers. One of our largest insurance companies that always has a large proportion of its surplus funds in the hands of farmers has this good word to say of the class; 'They are not borrowing near so much money, and what they do get is in small amounts. They are paying the interest on old loans promptly, and don't have to make new loans to pay off old ones. As it is with us, so it is with all the other money lenders, and this all goes to show that times are better and the money market easier.'"

The Chronicle says that President Harrison has shown considerable shrewdness in deciding not to put his message into type, but to have it copied on the typewriter. Heretofore there has generally been trouble about the premature publication of the message, and it has been found impossible to fix the responsibility. Now Elijah H. Ford and his assistant will be the only ones who can be blamed should the document be published before its delivery.

The Boston Globe mentions a barrel of American flour would once buy at Rio a bag of coffee weighing 30 pounds more than the present ones, whereas it now takes five barrels of flour to make the barter. Nineteen staples of trade have gone down in price, while coffee has more than doubled. People now want to make in five years what would once have been considered the work of forty years, some do it, but the great majority become bankrupt. The commission houses make profits out of this speculation, but that adds nothing to the prosperity of the country. It is neither more nor less than gambling to buy and sell on the exchange 22,000,000 bags of coffee on an average crop of 5,000,000 bags.

HUSBANDMAN says that it is just a little startling—the thought that all the gold brought out of this continent in the last fifty years, has not been sufficient to pay for the sugar produced by other countries, brought through our custom houses and consumed in that time by the people of these—this—United States.

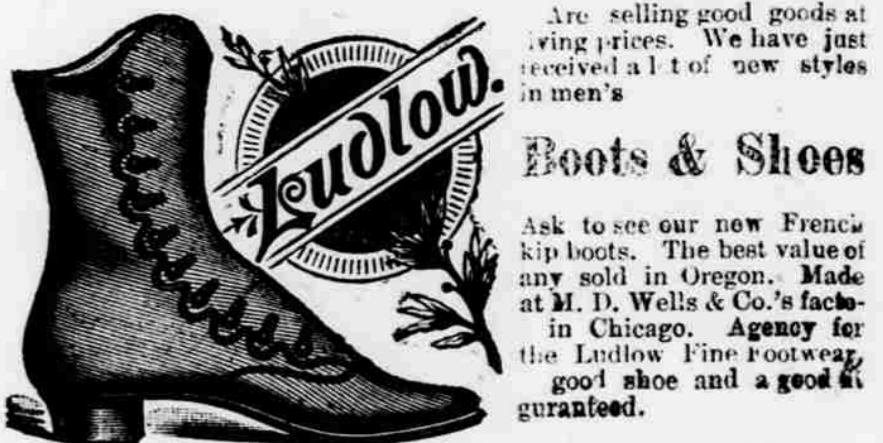

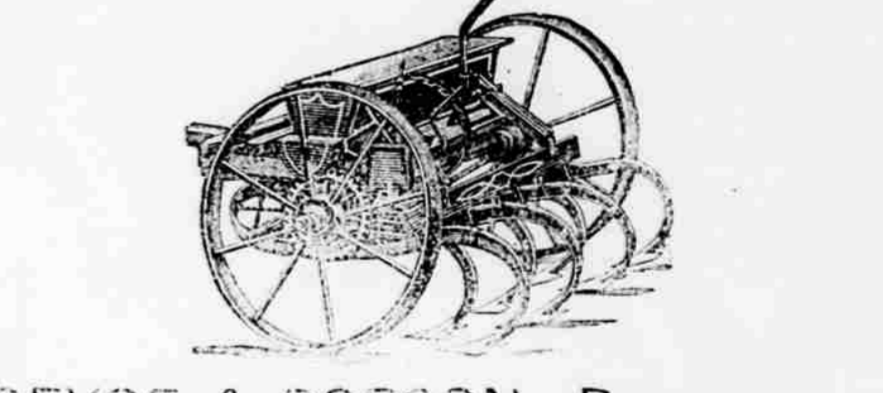
