EDITORIAL NOTES: Poor Africa is likely to be divided up among the voracious nations of Europe, not even a slice of it left for poor old Africa which will be a name without a country.

ALBANY real estate is the best investment in Oregon. It is as safe as money placed in the bank, and has made thousands of dollars for investors during the past twelve months, while they were asleep.

The Eiffel tower is said to have not only paid all expenses, but a dividend to its stockholders; that fact will probably cause a rush for the stock in the proposed 92 fair aping after Eiffel in this country.

The Astorian has in its office in Astoria, a large lump of genuine coal obtained from the Nehalem, on the line of the railroad. In that matter Albany has also a co-interest with Astoria, as it is upon the line of road between the two places.

The flag with forty-two stars upon its blue field will be the legal emblem of this country upon the morning of the next 4th of July, and not until then. The flinging it to the breeze prior to that time will be tolerated only on the understanding that it is what will be upon that date.

The development of the rich Santiam mining district, the new manufacturing, extensive railroad building, lumbering business and other enterprises on foot in this city, all conspire to make Albany the growing business center of Oregon. The city's population during the past three years has increased at the rate of 1800 souls per annum, and the census of 1890 should see the city with 14,000 inhabitants.

The possibilities of the successful evolution of a smokeless and soundless gunpowder, or explosive that shall supercede gunpowder, raises some queer speculations in the human mind. If the assassin can silently and without visible sign plug the death dealing lead into his unsuspecting victim, from a safe distance, how in the world is the lives of citizens to be guarded by bringing murderers to punishment. The government has been solicited to aid the development of this new explosive, it had better aid in its suppression.

STATE Superintendent of Schools, E. B. McElroy is now busy sending out the fall supply of goods to the county superintendents. The following blanks, registers, etc., are furnished by the state, viz: district clerks' blank reports, teachers' blank reports, county superintendents' blank registers and record books (large and small), teachers' school registers, district clerks' record books, teachers' blank certificate books, receipt books for teachers' certificate fees, blank receipt books (state and county school funds) and blank receipt books for county treasurer.

Money continues to be said in regard to the strength and plans of the Mormon church. Nearly all conclusions summed up on the subject, make the acme of danger to be feared from it, to be the practice of polygamy which is still secretly carried on by the adherents of the church of latter day sepiants. The real danger, however, is not in that peculiar institution, but in the assumption of civil power and control by the Mormon church. Polygamy, if it were not made a special object of this peculiar religious belief, and that belief backed by the real underlying civil power of the locality where it exists, could not continue, for dis-

gust of its very self would stamp it out. The religious domination of the government is all that maintains it in any part of the world where it now exists, and the thorough divorcement of church and state will wipe it out everywhere. The Mormon control of governmental affairs is the point to guard against. No church should be allowed to meddle with or control any civil proceedings.

Two very conscientious men have surrendered themselves to the New York police for being implicated in the altercation that they thought ended in the death of Martin Flinn, who died from a stab in the eye. One of the men had been assaulted on the street and defended himself with his umbrella which he supposed executed the fatal stab; the other man had a fight on the street with a stranger who insulted his wife, and supposed it to be Flinn and that he had given him his fatal stab.

Neither one of the two in all probability stand any show of being subjects for electrical execution under the New York law.

Edison is reported as saying at one time that underground wires were impracticable for lighting purposes, as they could not be insulated; and at another time that no known insulator could resist the action of the air, and that he did not advocate overhead wires and never put up any. Under consideration of the two statements the average thinking man will naturally inquire how Mr. Edison proposes to convey his electricity from his dynamo to his lamps, the only practical method in sight being by wires in some manner, and they must be above or under the ground.

The confession made by one of the Fox sisters, of the celebrated Rochester, New York, first promoters of spirit rappings, made several months ago to the effect that the original manifestations were tricks played upon a credulous public, has been supplemented by the lady disclaiming the confession and claiming that she was coerced into making it by the great stress she was in at the time for money, which she says was promised her for the action she took. All of this neither proves or disproves the spiritualistic claims but simply emphasizes the fact that human judgment and discernment were given for guides to human beings, and should be fully exercised under all and every circumstance.

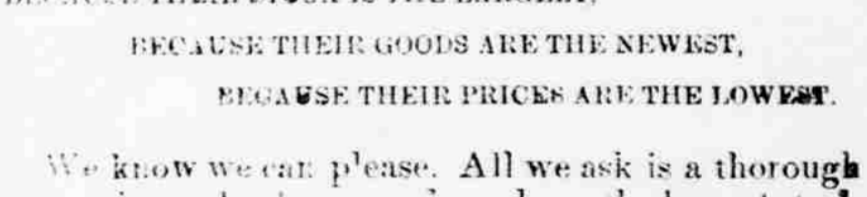
