There is more talk than any-
thing else about war in Central
America. Every petty village row
or neighborhood squabble is called
a revolution, and every fight be-
tween roving bands of ruffians or
outlaws is magnified into a war.

The latest rumor is that Guatemala
and Salvador are shortly going to
war, though what either of them
has to fight about is past finding
out. If they do not keep the peace
and mind their own business it
will serve them right to have
Mexico swoop down and gobble up
the whole five states of Central
America, and Mexico, it is be-
lieved, would be very willing to do
it.

News from Washington brings
the intelligence that Representative
Herman has submitted to con-
gress a series of resolutions, passed
by the Oregon legislature, urging
the forfeiture of the Northern
Pacific railroad grant between
Wallula and Portland, Or. The
resolutions recite the various diffi-
culties which this grant puts in the
way to the development of the
country. Senator Dolph and
Representative Hermann are con-
fident that such a measure as the
above will become a law early in
the session.

The speaker of the House has
appointed the committees. Con-
gressman Hermann of Oregon was
given a place on the river and har-
bor committee, and was made
chairman of the committee on
Indian depredation claims.

A cold wave is reported at St.
Paul and northward, which is ap-
proaching the Northwest. Oregon
is likely to experience a touch of
winter during the holiday season.

ported in California and the rivers
are again rising, threatening another
delay of trains.
