Admiral Walker's Squadron Reaches Portland. LISBON, Dec. 22.—The man-of-war Yorktown, of the United States squadron, had not arrived here up to noon to-day. Admiral Walker reports that the non-arrival is due to severe weather. The Chicago exchange salutes with the land batteries and Admiral Walker paid an official visit to the Portuguese officers. The squadron will remain for ten days and will then go to the Mediterranean.

THE INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC. It Has Made Its Appearance in Aristocratic Families. VIENNA, Dec. 24.—A number of persons in the hospitals who have been suffering with influenza are stricken with inflammation of the lungs and several of them have died. Influenza has made its appearance in the Jesuit school at Kalksburg, the victims of which are the children of aristocratic people. Seventy-eight scholars have been attacked.
