## FATAL COLLISION.

The Oregon Runs Into and Sinks a British Ship.  
**TWO MEN WERE KILLED.**  
 The Clan-McKenzie Struck Without a Moments Warning in the Columbia at Coffin Rock.

**PORTLAND, Dec. 27.**—At 1:30 o'clock this morning the Union Pacific Pacific steamer Oregon ran into and sank the British ship Clan-McKenzie at Coffin Rock, on the Columbia, about ten miles below Kalamia.  
 The Clan-McKenzie is an iron ship, and was on her way up from Astoria, where she arrived a few days ago from Rio Janeiro with a cargo in ballast, consigned to Laidlow & Co.  
**COFFIN ROCK, Dec. 27.**—The ill-fated Clan-McKenzie came to anchor last night till morning, and high tide should come up. She lay with her bow up stream, and was riding in the Oregon side of channel, close in to the shore. Captain Simpson, her master, said: "My watchman, James Ward, was on deck. We had just put out fresh lights on the masthead and the side lights were all put out. She was straight with the channel and did not swing an inch."  
 "Leaving the watchman on deck, I and the officers and crew turned into the bunks. My wife was with me. I was soundly sleeping, when suddenly I was awakened by a tremendous jar and crashing, and heard the water pouring into the hold. I immediately got the boats out, after finding that the ship was sinking, and took my wife and crew ashore. Two of my men, both colored, were killed instantly. My bow was completely torn away. The Oregon struck the ship on the starboard side, just between the stern and cathead, and was not from the side. My lights were all out, as I was not in the channel."  
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 In the meanwhile the Oregon drifted about 100 feet on the shore, from which position she was soon extracted.  
 Soon after daylight this morning she took on board the captain of the Clan-McKenzie and steamed back to Portland, arriving at Alneworth dock at 11:30 o'clock.  
**THE CORBETT-CAMPBELL FIGHT.**  
 The interest in the Corbett-Campbell boxing match, which took place at the mechanics' pavilion to-morrow night, is increasing.  The match at the pavilion to-morrow night will be a scene of sporting exhibition, and one scoring the greatest number of clean hits or points in ten rounds will be declared the winner. Parties who expect a bloodthirsty contest or knock out will be disappointed, as the pavilion managers will not permit such. Hard blows will undoubtedly be exchanged and an exciting contest will be witnessed, but it will not be a prize fight.
