

THE DEADLY LA GRIPPE.

The Disease is Still Spreading in New York City.

New York, Jan. 9.-The la grippe is spreading in this city, as is shown by yesterday's mortality list, which reached 260 deaths up to noon. This is the biggest number known in the history of the health department in twenty-four hours during the winter months, and occurred, sixty-eight of which were from sunstroke.
