EDITORIAL NOTES

FALL sown wheat ought to be a fine crop next year, for the blanket of snow protects and fertilizes it.

It is said that the mine from which Stanton, the Baker City murderer in 1855, brought in several ounces of placer gold has been re-discovered and is likely to prove a famous bonanza.

In the death of Geo. L. Woods, Oregon loses one of its most talented and pleasing public speakers, whose eloquence has carried the sympathies of the people in many political contests.

A BAND of masked men rode into Hamilton, Georgia, recently and battered down the doors of the jail and released the notorious outlaw of Harrist Co., Willie Wallace. Still we are told that it is all peace and quiet in the south and that there is no outburst.

The sound country is suffering from a potato famine. The farmer who raised and saved a good crop of that universally eaten vegetable last season, is in luck now for the market is ready and the prices way up. Other crops may be king but the potato is no slouch.

PORTLAND is suffering from a water famine. Probably they will store up remembrance of its pinching and distress, to work upon the sympathies of the next legislature towards procuring those non-taxable bonds in which to invest their spare ducats.

The Wide West, a steamer built for river traffic on the Columbia, braved the wrath of old Pacific ocean to reach the sound, but never got there. Pacific took revenge and piled her bones on the beach, and the crew, thankful for an escape with their lives, made a tramp across the Olympic mountains to the settlements. Steamboats like men should keep their places.

The youngest daughter of Ex-Secretary Bayard, Miss Ellen Bayard, it is said is about to marry Count Lewenhaupt, a former attaché of the Swedish Legation at Washington. If the American girls all go for European counts and lords the American young men will have to turn the tables and cross the water and capture the European countesses and lordesses. God pity both the American girls and boys in that predicament however.

The Washington legislature assembled in Olympia, had their most spirited election excitement over the making of a chaplain. The men who perambulate with bass drums and tamborines were on hand with a candidate but did not win, fortunately for our christian civilization. The disaffected members over the election threaten to have the chaplain's salary cut off on the grounds of, unconstitutional of the election.

The Nicaragua Canal is being pushed ahead as fast as prudence and good management will warrant. The Canal people, it appears, realizing the great magnitude of their enterprise, are proceeding very quietly and in a cautious manner. Contracts and sub-contracts, with detailed specifications, are being very carefully and thoroughly prepared. The recent change of location of the Atlantic terminus of the canal has solved the problem of Greytown harbor, which will be made one of the best harbors on the coast.

UNFORTUNATELY the prospects are that the irrigation subsidy measures before congress are likely to fail, and no appropriation will be made for that purpose. It is certainly a matter of regret that such is the case, for no other matter of equal importance takes precedence in the present congress. Money wisely and judiciously

expended in that direction would do more towards advancing the interests of the government and enhancing the wealth of the country than any other method of expenditure, and it is to be hoped that wiser counsels will finally prevail and that the irrigation projects will be inaugurated.

OUR merchant marine is one of the most important questions to consider, and congress is grappling with it. Senator Frye's bill provides for government aid to American sailing vessels as well as steamships. Steam will never displace sail power for the transportation of certain kinds of products on long voyages, and if the United States want to contest the carrying trade of the world with Great Britain and other foreign countries aid must be extended in some way to sailing vessels as well as to those propelled by steam.

DEATH, more merciful and just than man, has stepped in and terminated the suffering, disgrace and shame, of Mrs. Southworth, who shot and killed her paramour, Stephen L. Pettus, on the streets of New York city, not long ago. She died in the Tombs prison before she was brought to trial. More sinned against than sinning, could only be the verdict of a just recognition of her crime, but the end of earthly existence stops the worry and the pain of living a life that has been shorn of all happiness or chance for better living. Judges and juries are but human, and the divine recognition of the true situation comes none to soon in a case like this, when all hope of human betterment is gone.
