EDITORIAL NOTES.

The entire legal question of the election in Montana will be reviewed by the Senate Committee

It is said that sorghum seed can be ground into flour that makes passable bread, and that it is coming into considerable use in that direction.

The committee in the House of Representatives, upon the Silcott defalcation case, made a three-fold report. That is, that many views of the situation were taken by the majority and different minority reports.

The decision of the United States court at Omaha, on a suit brought by the Union Pacific Railroad Company, to compel the Northern Pacific Company to accept passenger tickets, sold by the Union Pacific Company, to extend to points on the Northern Pacific north of Portland, in favor of the Union Pacific, will establish the fact that railroads must accept an exchange of traffic, and that the narrow policy of refusing to accept cannot be indulged in even if they are foolish enough to so desire.

An instrument called the telegraphone is said to have been patented, which enables the sender to record his message on a cylinder attached to the receiving instrument, in the absence of any one to hear it, and even to repeat the message back to himself for correction. But one curious fact remains, after all the announcements of improvements in telegraphic instruments and devices, that is, that the old signaling alphabet that Prof. Morse first projected remains in use, and is the only method that really stands the test of practice.

The health peculiarities of the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, as far as the winter season is concerned, seems to antipodal in their relations. Cold, freezing weather is a health requisite, apparently, on the Atlantic coast, while on this coast directly the opposite is the requisite. This winter it is said the people of New York are paying the penalty of a balmy open winter. The death rate has increased at an enormous rate, and the diseases which are popularly attributed to cold weather are particularly virulent in their attacks. Evidently the eastern seaboard is not cut out for pleasant winter weather, for it is noticeable that the health of the people in the large Atlantic coast cities is always better in cold weather than when the winters are balmy and open. While the warm weather there has been so disastrous, here the trifling cold snap we have had has led to colds and sickness of like nature, to quite an extent. Warm, rainy weather, interspersed with sunshine fits our coast exactly, and cold and snow are out of place.

It is a fact, in regard to appliances for the safe keeping of valuables, such as safes, vaults, combination locks and many other inventions, calculated to make the pathway of the adventurous crackman a difficult one, that the burglariously inclined part of the community keep even pace in the matter of inventions, and as soon as a

new device is brought out set their wits to work to circumvent it and gain their ends. So too in the field of warfare just as soon as the inventive genius brings out a new destructive implement other inventive geniuses bring out some counteracting agent to take away the superior power of the new invention. The late invention of smokeless powder caused not a little excitement in military circles. Veterans who have been under fire will readily appreciate the benefit of smokeless powder to the attacking force, always provided that the enemy is compelled to remain enshrouded in the dense clouds arising from their own explosives. Now comes a Frenchman with a smoke bomb, a huge shell containing smoke of a peculiarly offensive odor and great opaqueness, which is intended to be hurled into the enemy's ranks thus counteracting the benefits of smokeless powder. If the latter will not envelop himself in the traditional smoke of battle, the Frenchman proposes to force upon him such a condition. Thus another ingenious provision of military science is met by a counteracting influence, and the fame of smokeless powder fades perceptibly. Trite though it be, the expression "the smoke of battle" seems destined to remain with us as useful in description of actual warfare as of political campaigns.
