EDITORIAL NOTES.

The New York World is responsible for the statement that the Brice senatorial election cost that millionaire \$300,000. But then he can afford it. Whether Ohio can or not remains to be seen.

In addition to the \$67,965,000 already expended upon the U. S. navy the senate committee has decided to recommend the expenditure of \$21,550,000 more. Good navies come high, but Uncle Sam ought to be able to sport one if any country can.

The blockade on the Southern Pacific railroad is assuming a serious aspect. Several hundred passengers are imprisoned by snow and provisions are getting low. On the top of this comes the great danger of disastrous floods and washouts from the melting snow.

The proposed widening of the Narrow Gauge Railroad is of special importance to Albany. It would give this city direct rail connection, via the Lebanon branch, with a wide scope of country, and probably another transcontinental line, as there is now a scheme to make the Narrow Gauge a standard road and push it to a connection with the Central Pacific.

If the railroad managers of the United States would expend a few thousand dollars for the purpose of arming their engineers, conductors and brakemen it is probable that the train robbery industry would soon go into a decline. Nothing could be more absurd than these repeated acts of highwaymanship in which one or two daredevils bring a railway train to a standstill and "go through" the passengers and the treasure box of the express company.

A dispatch from Berlin states that in the stomach of a shark which was recently dissected in that city was found a dolphin weighing 120 pounds, forty-three fish, a de-composed seal, a human arm, and four human legs. With what earnestness that shark must have been accustomed to put up the petition: May good digestion wait on appetite. Reading between the lines of the dispatch, we seem to gather that it was dyspepsia that carried him off.

The international conference in Washington, upon Marine subjects, has been one of the important recent meetings. The Boston Journal says that some surprise has been occasioned by the fact that the Marine conference at Washington adjourned almost with the incoming of the new year, instead of continuing in session two months longer, as it had been authorized to do by congress. It has even been suggested that the conference had come pretty near a failure, but such an idea is totally unwarranted. Though the deliberations have not covered all topics which it was hoped to consider, yet substantial and, on the whole, satisfactory results have been achieved, and if decisions of the conference receive the sanction of the several governments, ocean commerce will be a great gainer by the gathering. The "rules of the road at sea" monopolized the chief attention of the conference. All but five of its daily sessions were devoted to this important topic, and it is believed that an improved code of regulations has been made available. Other subjects discussed were proper boat and life-raft equipments for passenger yessels, a uniform system of buoyage, and the removing of wrecks and similar

obstructions to navigation. The idea of a permanent international maritime commission was rejected. It is intimated that Great Britain, which, with its customary jealousy of the United States, agreed only tardily and with bad grace to enter the Washington conference, is to issue invitations for another conference in London in the immediate future.

DISPATCHES report that "the Czar is deeply affected" at the nihilist conspiracy recently discovered. He is so grieved at this in mark of base ingratitude on the part of people over whose lives he watches with the minute solicitude of a nursery governess that his recovery from the grip is retarded. The period of prolonged convalescence gives him opportunity to reflect upon certain truths which the pastors and masters of his youth seem not sufficiently to have impressed upon his mind. Here are a few of these truths: This is the latter part of the nineteenth century, and the garments of fourteenth-century institutions do not fit the time. In this age human nature is intuitively conscious of the possession of rights as well as of duties, and when rights are persistently denied, men are tempted to complain, to remonstrate, to protest. When they are forbidden to formulate their complaints in the shape of proposals for remedial legislation, and when the penalty of death or penal servitude awaits even the writer of a protesting letter to a newspaper, there is really nothing for it but to throw bombs at the man who represses other forms of expression. In countries where speech is free and power resides in the people, conspiracy is a crime and bomb-throwing is monstrous. But in conspiracy is nothing more than a gentle murmur of dissatisfaction. It is not wise to sit on the safety-valve. The practice has a tendency to convert useful energy into destructive force. The people have a right to govern themselves. Sooner or later they are going to do it. Those who place themselves in front of the engine will be run over.
