THE RAILROADS.

Trains to Be Running from Portland to Roseburg by Tuesday.

THE SOUTHERN BLOCKADE. Eighteen Inches of Snow Remains in the Cow Creek Canyon—A Train from Creswell Reaches Roseburg.

Special to the Herald. PORTLAND, Feb. 6.—The situation on the Southern Pacific road is not as hopeless as it seemed at first, when the great floods came on top of the snow blockade in Southern Oregon and Northern California.

Large forces of men are at work along the road in Oregon in all the places where washouts have occurred, making temporary repairs with all possible speed.

The train which left Albany Saturday morning and has been detained since at Creswell, reached Roseburg this evening, the track being now open for full south.

There is still 18 inches of snow in the Cow Creek canyon. The men of the Western Union Telegraph company, who left Kildes this morning with an engine, could get no further than Cow Creek, where the engine went dead, and the men proceeded on foot to continue the work of repairing the prostrated wires.

The officials of the Southern Pacific company are quoted as saying that it is likely the road will be repaired so that trains will be running by Monday or Tuesday.

THE SOUTHERN BLOCKADE. The recent warm rains extended generally throughout most of Northern California. Trains are still blocked both by snow and floods.

ON THE OREGON PACIFIC. Trains Will Be Running Eastward Tomorrow—100 Men at Work.

F. J. Miller superintendent of bridges on the Oregon Pacific road returned yesterday from Yaquina on the first train to reach Corvallis since Saturday.

He has been at work with 100 men and put in five bridges that had washed out and repaired two more that were wrecked.

The track was also cleared of three big land slides and several small ones. The road is now open to Bower's slough four miles west of Albany.

A work train will go to the front to-day and Mr. Miller thinks the track to Gates will be open to-morrow and trains running that far eastward.

In the four miles of damaged road west of Albany there are four bridges out and two miles of grade washed away. It will require at least a week or ten days to repair this.

Women's Rights to Timber Lands. The right of married women to make timber land entries in Oregon was affirmed by Secretary Noble, on an appeal from an adverse ruling by the commissioner of the general land office.

The commissioner refused to issue patents in a large number of cases, claiming that a married woman in this state could not take advantage of the timber land act relating to the purchase of timber lands in California, Oregon, Washington and Nevada, because the laws of Oregon do not give to a married woman the right to dispose of property without the consent of her husband.

This was a surprise and a great disappointment to a number of women who had filed upon and made application to purchase timber land, and they will be glad to learn that the commissioner's decision is that a married woman can purchase timber land by entry under the law.
