THE NEW STATES.

The new states that have come into the Union during this season have not distinguished themselves, or made a very brilliant record, and basing an opinion on what they have legislatively accomplished, their territorial swaddling clothes were cast aside long before they should have been.

The record is certainly not pleasing to view. Washington has been and still is legislatively making a great noise, but the session has simply been prolonged with the most trifling of school-boy quarrels and very little has been accomplished.

In Montana the situation is even worse. The sheriff has been chasing the refractory senators over country, and the solons seem to be engaged in a game of hide and seek. The trouble is over the very silly efforts of the democratic members to prevent a quorum and to obstruct the business of the legislature.

Up in North Dakota the new state has distinguished itself by licensing a state lottery. On the whole the new states have made a most disgraceful record during the first few months of their existence, and they should begin early to redeem themselves in the eyes of the older, wiser and more conservative states of the Union.

THEODORE TILTON, of Tilton-Beecher note, is living quietly, and alone on an island in the river near Paris, stating that he is a martyr and an exile for truth's sake.

In an interview he sums up his life thus: "I live the life of a hermit on a lonely isle in the river, and I am king upon the isle of St. Louis. My house is to me a palace. My carriage awaits in the shape of the Seine river boat which runs by my door. The Gothic steeple of Notre Dame church is near by, and the morgue is not distant—handy enough should I be found dead in my lonely chamber. I have contempt for the unjust of humanity in general, but love for the beautiful, and no desire to see the face of any human being. Beecher ruined my career. There remains for me literature and the right of quietly leading a life of silent enjoyment of pursuits best befitting my tastes. I am constantly employed writing poetry. The music of the church bells and the artistic surroundings of my home remind me of those who in times past lived and suffered from man's injustice. I will never lecture or go into public life again."

The usual vexatious and tedious delays in legal transactions, was pretty well illustrated in the case of John Most, the anarchist who some two years ago was put on trial for misdemeanor in using language inciting riot and disturbance. He was convicted of a misdemeanor and sentenced to imprisonment in the city penitentiary for one year. The case was appealed to the general term of the supreme court, which a few days ago affirmed the proceedings of the lower court and Most will have to serve out the year in prison, unless the court of appeals overturns the decision, should the case be appealed. Most has already served one term of imprisonment for a like offence. Judge Cowing, before whom he was convicted on the second occasion, allowed him a stay of proceedings pending an appeal in the case. Justice may be

blindfolded, as the popular myth assumes, but that mythical representation should also give her the locomotion of the tortoise to represent her action in cases of this kind.

Put yourself in his place was practically exemplified recently by a Kansas clergyman, who on a recent Sunday preached a sermon on "The Struggle for Existence," in the course of which he told of his experience during a day spent, dressed in the attire of a common laborer, in quest of work. He walked ten miles and secured one hour's work in putting in coal. The only kindness he met with was from men of the class to which he assumed to belong, those of the employing caste usually treating him curtly, if not with actual rudeness. He said that, had his supper and bed really depended upon success, his disappointment could not have been more bitter.

The proposition to abolish the use of French as an official language in the northwest territory is likely to solidify the race elements in Canada and bring about a test of strength. The antagonism of blood and religion has existed for years, but here is a distinct issue, upon which the fight may come on.

The death of Adam Forepaugh removes a man whose fame and face are more generally known than are those of the president of the United States. Ten men are vitally interested in the coming of a circus where one is moved by the approach of a general election.

SOUTH DAKOTA is not likely to speedily forget its first months of statehood. With official insolvency on the one hand and the starvation of its citizens on the other, the year 1890 will go into its history fringed with black.
