THE MORMON DEFEAT.

The defeat of the Mormons in the municipal election in Salt Lake city means much more than appears on the face of it.

The city of Salt Lake took a new lease of life when it passed from the control of the Mormon hierarchy by the free and natural process of popular election. The liberals, as the Gentiles call themselves, had made a very vigorous campaign, not only before the people, but in the courts, fighting illegal registration of Mormons at every step and rallying their own forces by all the methods known to politics.

There is a growing discontent among nearly all the foreign nations ruled by monarchs. The thrones of the strongest are in a tottering condition, and the signs of the times indicate that it will not be many years before they will follow Brazil's example, and adopt a republican form of government, not by bloodshed and war, for the people are ready for the change and it will be done quietly.

Two Mormon elders in Marion county, Georgia, were engaged in making up a party of proselytes for Utah, when they were notified to leave. They paid no heed, and one night a party of masked citizens took the holy men into the woods, gave them fifty lashes each, applied tar and feathers to their bleeding backs, lighted the tar and turned the saints loose.

Even the democratic press do not all uphold the action of the minority obstructionists in the house of representatives. The Brooklyn Eagle, one of the staunchest of Democratic exponents comes out in condemnation of the action of the obstreperous members and says that "it would seem to be a rudimentary and essential power of a deliberative body to decide whether it is present for business. If such a decision is at the momentary mercy of a few members through a technical falsehood, the possibilities of obstruction are unlimited."

Russian cruelties and Russian intolerance continue to be the swaying influence of the Russian government. The latest upon this

subject is the story of unparalleled cruelties practiced in the suppression of a revolt among the prisoners at Kara, the revolt being occasioned by the indignities practiced upon the female prisoners by the prison authorities.

The anarchists have been accomplishing their hellish designs in Harney county again, says the Grant county News. The News is informed by Frank McBean that they burned four stacks of John Devine's hay a few nights ago, aggregating 200 tons. Rags saturated with kerosene were found on the ground, snowing conclusively that the fire was set deliberately.

The five Chicago hoodle county commissioners, whose terms at Joliet had expired, were released Monday evening and returned to Chicago. There had been talk by their friends there of giving them a grand reception, but it was not carried out.

The matter of the Samoan treaty is finally decided by the ratification of the treaty prepared by the Berlin conference. By it and the purchase of land the United States is made secure in a coaling station on the island, which is all that was wanted.

SECRETARY TRACY has decided to present a silver service to Chief Parrish of the fire department, and gold watches to Policeman Cattell and Fireman Wright, for their heroic action at the Tracy fire in Washington.

SENATOR CHANDLER has proposed a bill to regulate immigration into the United States, which is intended to include the best parts of the various bills now pending.
