

NEW MEXICO RAILROADS.

Five New Lines Proposed or Under Construction.

Active work is in progress on five different railway projects in New Mexico, and this work is of such a nature as to make it reasonably claimed that these lines will be completed during the year.

These enterprises, if carried out, will increase our railway mileage about 550 miles. They cover sections of the Territory that are in great need of railway facilities, and there are business reasons why they should be built.

Brownsville, March 24.

The county surveyor was here last week and laid off part of the old Galbraith farm and part of Thomas Kay's land, some twenty-five acres in all, into lots, with sixty feet streets, and the property is to be put on the market immediately.

By Accident.
