The mutations of human an-

Call for a Republican State Con-
vention.
A Republican Convention for the State
of Oregon, is called to meet at the city of
Portland on Wednesday the 16th day of April,
1890, at 11 o'clock A. M. for the purpose
of nominating candidates for the office of
Congressman, Governor, Supreme Judge, Sec-
retary of State, State Treasurer, Superintendent
of Public Instruction, State Printer and Dis-
trict officers, and to transact such other
business as may properly come before the
convention. The convention will consist of
216 delegates apportioned among the several
counties as follows:

Baker 6, Benton 5, Clackamas 5, Clatsop
8, Columbia 4, Coos 3, Curry 3, Douglas 5,
Gilliam 5, Grant 5, Harney 3, Hood 3,
Josephine 4, Klamath 3, Lake 3, Lane 10,
Lincoln 10, Malheur 3, Marion 12, Morrow 3,
Multnomah 23, Polk 12, Tillamook 11,
Umatilla 10, Union 8, Wallowa 1, Wasco 8, Sherman
3, Washington 2, Yamhill 8.

The same being one delegate at large from
each county, and one delegate for every 175
votes, and one for every fraction over one
half thereof cast for congressmen at the June
election of 1888. The committee recom-
mend that the primaries be held on April
15th, and the county conventions on April 16th,
unless otherwise ordered by the proper
county committee. All voters who favor the
Republican policy of American markets for
the products of American labor, liberal sup-
port of our common schools and the pro-
tection of every voter in the nation, in the
right to cast a free ballot and have it fairly
counted are cordially invited to make the
selection of delegates to the Republican
State Convention. L. T. BABIN,
