THAT RAILROAD DECISION. Comment and discussion has been freely indulged in by the press

The Railroad Commission of that state fixed freight rates and fares, under an act of the legislature

The New York Tribune, which takes the extreme railroad side of the question says: "The question at issue in these cases might almost be stated thus: "Do the railroads in this country belong to the states, or to their owners; are they required to transport for the public benefit exclusively, or in part for the benefit of the people who have invested money in them?"

It is not essential in connection with this point to consider in detail the precise orders reviewed by the Supreme Court. The question is not so much whether those orders were just or unjust, as whether a commission created by legislative authority had final power to decide whether rates made were just or unjust.

The decision of the Supreme Court, on the contrary, is in effect simply this, that the legislature has no right to take the property of a company without due process of law, and that if a legislature, or a commission created by a legislature has final authority to decide whether rates are or are not reasonable, and if the company affected has no opportunity to appeal to the courts for redress, the legislature may take the property of the company without due process of law.

This view of the question, as by the Tribune, is so emphatically and entirely upon one side of the jug, that it is in reality a fraud and a delusion.

It entirely ignores the interests involved, expecting those belonging to the railroad side of the question, and takes a misconception as to the basis of its argument. Railroads condemn and appropriate private property to their uses, and become public carriers, and yet the argument of the Tribune and the decision of the Supreme Court—under the interpretation of the Tribune—means that there is no means of putting any restriction upon the charges that railroads may make.

to control and keep with bounds the railroad charges, but upon the joint of whether in this individual case the rates fixed by the commission were reasonable and just.

The decision merely holds that the reasonableness and justness of rates fixed by a commission are subject to review by the courts, and are not final as promulgated by the commissions.

The Tribune goes on to say that "there is force in the statement by the minority of the court that the decision thus rendered overrules, at least in a measure, previous decisions by the same court regarding the regulative power of the legislature. But it has been gravely doubted for years past whether the tendency of judicial decisions has not been too far on the side of absolute control of the property of corporations by state legislatures. Investors have felt, not without reason, that these decisions have gone far toward depriving them of virtual ownership of practical use of their property, and toward conferring upon legislatures, and through them upon the public, the virtual ownership and practical use of such property. The new decision by the court indicates a decided movement in the opposite direction, and is likely to be of great influence in checking unreasonable action by state legislatures and state commissions."

The position taken in this that the previous decisions were "too far on the side of absolute control of the property of corporations by state legislatures," is certainly a gross misrepresentation, for legislative and commission action has never yet touched the property of corporations; but has only attempted to control the power of the railroads to levy upon the property of others. The position taken by the Tribune would simply give the railroad full sway in that direction.

The real meaning of the Supreme Court decision, however, that they should be some means of reviewing the work of the commission as to the justness and reasonableness of the rates it establishes, is eminently proper.

Call for a Republican State Convention.

A Republican Convention for the State of Oregon, is called to meet at the city of Portland on Wednesday the 10th day of April, 1890, at 11 o'clock a. m. for the purpose of nominating candidates for the office of Congressman, Governor, Supreme Judge, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, State Printer and District Officers, and to transact such other business as may properly come before the convention. The convention will consist of 25 delegates appointed among the several counties as follows:

Baker, Benton 8, Clackamas 5, Clatsop 5, Columbia 4, Coos 4, Curry 3, DeWitt 2, Gilliam 6, Grant 5, Harney 4, Jackson 7, Josephine 4, Klamath 5, Lake 5, Lane 10, Lincoln 10, Malheur 5, Marion 12, Morrow 4, Multnomah 25, Polk 6, Tillamook 5, Umatilla 10, Union 8, Wallowa 4, Wasco 2, Sherman 2, Wheeler 6, Yamhill 6.

The above being one delegate at large from each county, and one delegate for every 175 votes, and one for every fraction over one half thereof cast for congressmen at the June election of 1888. The committee recommend that the primaries be held on April 15th, and the county conventions on April 16th, unless otherwise ordered by the proper county officers. All voters who favor the Republican policy of American markets for the products of American labor, liberal support of our common schools and the protection of every voter in the nation, in his right to cast a free ballot and have it fairly counted are so-called invited to unite in the selection of delegates to the Republican State Convention.
